

Sandwich Islands 1842 -
Sunday January the 22 -

comes in with strong gales from S.E., all hands on shore and expecting every moment the ship will go next - middle part more moderate, latter part board her with one boat, but such a heavy swell on, we got a few things, and returned to the shore again, leaving to her own mercy again, so ends

Monday January the 23

comes with light E. wind, but a heavy swell running so that it is impossible to get out with the ship, all hands on shore - middle part rainy, latter part at 7 A.M. all hands go on board again, the weather being fine, and no much swell, and with the assistance of the "Karnakars, from shore, we commence getting our ship under way, and with three of our boats, and two of their double canoes, manned with karnakars, on, ahead of the ship & being we take our anchor, and get out clear, from shore, once more, so ends, one man sick

Tuesday January the 24

begins with light S.W. winds lay off and on, sent up the maintopgallant mast at 5 P.M. the Captain came on board with his wife, and Reverent, Mr. Forbs, and Mr. Abel, the two gentlemen are passengers for "Hohoo" - middle part lay off by S.E. - at daylight saw "Hohoo, bearing S.E. distant 15 leagues, latter part, light air - so ends

Sandwich Islands 1843
Wednesday January the 25

comes in with light breezes beating up for "Hohoo, middle part much the same, latter part, employed in ship duty so ends -

Thursday January the 26
begins with light S.E. trades, beating up for "Hohoo, at night "Barbars point bearing S.N.E. distant 15 miles, middle part, beating up, latter part the same so ends, one man sick

Friday January the 27

comes in with light winds beating up for the harbour, latter part light westerly winds, at 7 A.M. the pilot came on board, and took her in at 11 A.M. dropped our anchor off Honolulu in 4 fathoms water muddy bottom, so ends

Saturday January the 28

begins with light pretty winds, middle part fine, latter part at 11 A.M. the head carpenter, and two artificers, came on board, to saw away our mack, and condemned the whole, so ends

Sunday January the 29

comes in with light pretty winds, middle part fine, latter part all hands on shore, so ends

Monday January the 30
begins with light Northerly winds, at 2 P.M. the Capt. Peabody from Columbia, at night all hands on board, middle part, rainy, latter part the same - so ends
"Hohoo"
