Thursday June the 15,
comes in with light breeze
from E, at 3 P.M. took the Whale to the
Ship, at 4 commenced cutting, at 9. got
the head and several blanket pieces
in, middle part fine, latter part
at 8 P.M. finished cutting, at noon comm.
boiling, so ends; Latitude 54-11- Long 151-30

Friday June the 16.
begins with light N.E. winds,
lay at anchor at 11 P.M. saw a Whale, lowered
two boats, the Larboard boat struck on
at 8 P.M. got the Whale along side, middle
part and latter boiling, lay by the Whale, so
ends. four men sick, Lat 54-26 Long 151-58
Saturday June the 17.

comes in with light Northely
winds, at 1 P.M. commenced cutting the
Whale at 10 P.M. finished, middle part
and latter, boiling, saw Whales, so ends
three men sick, Lat 54-20 Long 151-45
Sunday June the 18, begins with light E. winds
and overcast, employed in boiling,
saw Whales. at 10 A.M. lowered, but, with
out success, so ends, Latitude 54-30 Long 151-
four men sick again,

Monday June the 19
comes in with light S.E. winds and hazy
weather, employed in boiling, middle and
latter part boiling, so ends. Three men sick
Latitude 54-25
Long 150-20

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Northwest
Tuesday June 20,
begins with light Southely winds
lay by, boiling; latter part at 8 P.M. saw
a Whale, lowered two boats, the Larboard boat
struck one at noon got the Whale along side
so ends. Lat 54-31 Long 150-00
Wednesday June 21-

begins with light Southely winds
lay by, boiling and stowing down, middle part
latter part, commenced cutting the Whale, so ends
Latitude, 54-25 Long 149-41

Thursday June the 22
comes in with light Southely winds, at 2 P.M.
finished cutting the Whale, lowered for another
but could not catch him at 7 P.M. spoke
the "Matusoff" New Bedford, a Whale, middle part
fine, latter part, stowing down oil, so ends
saw plenty of finbacks, three men sick, Lat 54-20 Long 149-49
Friday June 23.

begins with light N.W. winds, lay by
stowing down oil, in company with the above
mentioned Ship, got several lances splintered, out
middle part light breezes, latter part saw plenty
of Whales, lowered but without success, so ends
eight men sick, Lat 54-20 Long 149-50
Saturday June 24

begins with strong Westly winds, employed
fishing and boiling, at 6 P.M. spoke the
"Hecate" Log Harbour, Lt. Paine 1400 lbs,
middle part boiling, latter part much the
same, Latitude 54-25
Longitude 149-40
