

Northwest 1842
Sunday June the 25

comes in with strong N.W. winds lay South, spoke the Schooner Parker and Barken, both of New Bedford the Schooner 5 months & 6 months, middle and latter part boiling so ends, five men sick, Lat 54.12 Long 149.20

Monday June the 26 begins with strong breezes and thick lay under double reef main top sail and fore sail finished boiling 150 barrels, middle and latter part thick so ends, Latitude 54.20 Long 149.00 five men sick

Tuesday June the 27 begins with thick rainy weather, the wind lay North, saw nothing worth noting, so ends, Latitude 54.25 Long 149.00

Wednesday June the 28 comes in with thick weather, lay North the wind Driftly - latter part spoke the Barque Rade 33 months out three whales so ends, Latitude 54.40

Thursday June the 29 comes in with strong Driftly winds lay North, the Cow was delivered of eleven pigs of which one is living, middle part light breezes and thick, latter part employed in stowing down oil in the after hold Latitude 54.30 Long 147.00

Northwest 1843 199
Friday June the 30

comes in with light Southerly winds lay S.E. employed in stowing down oil, three Ships in sight, middle part strong gales, at 3 P.M. attended with rain put our oil below, set the foretop sail and steered by West, so ends, Latitude 54.48.00 Longitude 148.00

Saturday July the 1 begins with strong Northerly winds and thick weather steering South middle part much the same, latter part clear, set the topsails and maintop gallant sail, steering South, so ends, four men sick, Lat 50.50 Long 149.00

Sunday July the 2 comes in with strong gales steering South, employed in cleaning, bent at night bent the gib, middle part strong breezes course South, latter part much the same so ends, Latitude 48.30 Long 150.00

Monday July the 3 begins with light S.W. breezes, lay S.E. bent a nother Maintop sail, middle part thick & fog latter part bent fore and maintop gallant sails, lay S.W. clearing fore, so ends five men sick, Latitude 46.10 Longitude 149.40

Tuesday July the 4 begins with strong S.W. winds lay S.E. at 4 P.M. bent the Mainsail, middle part strong breezes and clear, latter part much the same so ends, Latitude 45.50 Long 147.40
