

Round for the Sandwich Islands. 1843
Saturday July the 15

begins with strong NE
trade steering S by E, middle; at 10 PM,
the foot rope to the foretop sail parted
called all hands unbent him and bent
it rather; latter part, sent up
mizzen yards, so ends, Latitude 53. 00
Long 152. 00

Sunday July the 16

comes in with light trade
steering S W by E, ~~fore~~ fore and main topmast
and topgallant standing sails, middle part
steering S W by E, latter part S P, at 10 PM
saw the East end of Mowee bearing S W, dis-
tance ten leagues, so ends three men sick,
Latitude 21. 1 Longitude 15. 31

Monday July the 17

begins with light trade
steering West, at 10 PM, we dropped our
anchor off Mowee in 11 fathoms water, mid-
dle part and latter, calm, so ends, two men
sick, Mowee

Tuesday July the 18

comes in with light, Westly winds; employed
in setting up shrouds, and stowing of between
decks, so ends, two men sick

Wednesday July the 19

begins with light breeze
got off 150 lbs. of water, finished, stowing of
between decks, so ends

Thursday July the 20

light breeze and pleasant, sent down the
Main top sail yard, one watch on shore
so ends, two men sick

Sandwich Islands 1843
Friday July the 21

comes in with light breeze
and pleasant, employed in fitting the rigging,
so ends, one watch on shore, two men sick
Saturday July the 22

attended with light
Westly winds, got off ten barrels of potatoes, and
24 goats, one hundred pumpkins, one watch
on shore, so ends, two men sick
Sunday July the 23

begins with light Westly
winds, one watch on shore so ends
Monday July the 24

comes in with light
Westly winds, middle and latter, fine
weather, so ends, Mowee

Tuesday July the 25

begins with light Northely winds, at 2 PM,
took our anchor, having the King and several
of Lords with him, and attendants; at 6 PM,
took the trade winds and shaped our course
for Pookoo, at 2 PM, saw diamond head, at
6 PM, dropped our anchor off Pookoo far
together with the Jamesmen; the
Wh. S. Ship Constellation, Comadore, Kerary
laying their, so ends, ends

Wednesday July the 26

light trade and
pleasant, one boat on shore, so ends

Thursday July the 27

attended with strong trade
and pleasant, one boat on shore, so ends
