

Sanawick Islands 1843.

Friday July the 28  
begins with strong trades.  
at 5 P.M. her Britannic Majesty's, Dublin,  
General Thomas came down and anchored  
so ends. one boat on shore

Saturday July the 29.  
attended with strong  
trades and squally, one boat on shore  
this day the joyful news was proclaimed  
to the King, that his flag and right full  
dominions should be restored to him  
again, so ends

Sunday July the 30 -  
light trades and pleasant weather

Monday July the 31 -  
light trades, and  
pleasant weather, at 10 A.M. the  
Sanawick Islands, flag was hoisted, under  
a grand salute from the men of war  
and forts; so ends

Tuesday August the 1  
attended with light trades, at 1 P.M. the  
Sarcosmura sailed, latter part, the  
Captain and Lady came on board me to  
our anchor, and lay off and on, so ends

Wednesday August the 2.  
attended with light  
trades at 2 P.M. Commodore Carey, came  
on board, after leaving, we stood off  
and see topsails, and courses; middle  
part, fine, latter part calm, saw  
the land, so ends

Bound for the United States of America, 1843

Thursday August the 3  
attended with light trades  
steering S.E., latter part, employed in  
shing up the staves, so ends, Lat. 19. 00

Friday August the 4  
comes in with light trades - and  
calm, so ends Long 157. 00

Saturday August the 5  
light breeze and pleasant, employed in  
Ships duty, so ends, Lat. 17. 30 Long 157. 30

Sunday August the 6  
begins with strong  
trades; lay S.E., middle part much the  
same, latter part light winds and squally  
so ends - Lat. 14. 40 Long 157. 00

Monday August the 7  
comes in with light S.W. winds  
lay S.W., middle part strong breeze, latter  
part much the same - so ends -  
two men sick, Lat. 13. 38 Long 157. 10

Tuesday August the 8  
begins with strong E. winds  
lay S.E., middle and latter part much  
the same, so ends, two men sick, Lat. 11. 2 Long 157. 00

Wednesday August the 9  
comes in with light breezes  
lay South. E. S.E., so ends, employed in Ships  
duty, two men sick, Lat. 9. 30, Long 156. 40

Thursday August 10  
begins with light E. winds  
lay South - middle and latter part  
S.E., employed in Ships duty -  
so ends, three men sick, Lat. 8. 10  
Long 157. 10
