

Towards Cape Horn

Tuesday August the 22nd

comes in with light trade
lay South, middle and latter part
much the same, employed in packing
hove, - two men sick, so ends

Latitude 13.01 Longitude 152.20

Wednesday August the 23rd

begins with light S.E.
trade, lay S.W., middle part lay S.
E, latter part much the same, so ends
three men sick, Latitude 14.45 Long 165

Thursday August the 24th

begins with light E. trade
winds lay S.W., middle part calm, latter
part light N.W. trade winds lay S.W., so ends
three men sick, Latitude 16.12 Long 165

Friday August the 25th

begins with light air from S.E., middle
part strong breezes and squalls, latter part much
the same, so ends, employed in mending the
sails, - three men sick, Lat 18.12 Long 167.55

Saturday August the 26th

begins with strong S.E. trade
lay S.W., middle part and latter, much
the same, so ends, three men sick. -
Latitude 20.26 Longitude 170.20

Sunday August the 27th

comes with strong trade, lay
S.W., middle and latter; lay S.W.,
so ends, Latitude 22.50 Longitude 171.00

Monday August the 28th

begins with strong trade, and
rains, lay S. under, single reef to foresails,
middle, and latter part much the same, Lat 24.41
Longitude 172.50

Towards Cape Horn, 1843.

Tuesday August the 29th

begins with strong S.E. winds, lay S.W.,
employed in ship's duty, middle part, fine -
latter part, employed in mending the main
sail, lay S.W., so ends, four men sick, Lat 25.45
Longitude 174.00

Wednesday August the 30th

comes in with light S.E. winds
lay S.W., at night bent the mainsail; middle
part rainy, latter part fine, so ends, three men
sick, Latitude 27.00 Longitude 184.38

Thursday August the 31st

begins with light E. trade winds, lay
S.W., middle much the same, latter part
steering S.W. by E, employed in mending the old
foresail, so ends, the men sick, Lat 28.37 Long 195.50

Friday August the 1st

Friday September the 1st 1843
comes in with brisk breezes from N.E.,
steering S.W. by E, at, steering sails, middle
part strong gales, latter part back in the
standing sails course S.W. by E, so ends, three men sick
Latitude 31.35 Longitude 199.10

Saturday August the 2nd

begins with strong gales from
Northward, steering S.W. by E, at night, came
down to a double reef fore & main topsail, and
foresail, it blowing a gale, and the sea running
high - latter part light N.W. winds, made all
sail again, steering S.W. by E, so ends,
three men sick, Latitude 33.24
Longitude 169.06
