Sunday August 28th These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from E.S. with pleasant weather at 3 P.M. jibed out the jib boom, Middle parts calm and cloudy, Latter parts moderate breezes from N.W. and pleasant, saw a sail to windward steering south so ends this day. Lat by Ch 30. 15.

Monday August 29th These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from N.W. and pleasant at 1 P.M. spoke Bark. United States of America 14 months out of 4th of sperm, Middle parts fresh breezes, Latter parts parts the same, in company with the ship, so ends this day. Lat by Ch 31. 15.

Tuesday August 30th These 24 hours commences with fresh breezes from N.W. with squalls of rain, at 11 P.M. took in gaff top sail, Middle parts more moderate, Latter parts strong breezes from S.S.W. at 1 P.M. riged in jib boom, at 4 A.M. spoke Bark Ship. Bomby of Bordeaux 15 days out bound to the Cape. No Ch this day.

Wednesday August 31st These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from S.S.W. and clear, Middle parts the same. Latter parts fresh breezes with squalls of rain, at 11 A.M. carried away the top mast, saw a ship to the seaward steering east, the United States a head. Lat by Ch 33. 22 S.

Thursday Sept 1st These 24 hours commences with fresh breezes from S.W. by S. and pleasant with a heavy south swell, Middle parts more moderate at 3 A.M. the wind hauled to the S.E. Latter parts light at 4 A.M. tacked ship in company with the U.S. so ends this day. Lat Ch 35. 35.

Friday Sept 2nd These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from E. and clear, at 1 P.M. spoke the U.S. and kept doing under her lee, Middle parts fresh breezes from S.E. attended with squalls of rain, at 11 P.M. took in the top sail, Latter parts fresh gales, at midnight took in main sail and jib, and have her to under the try sail for fear of the funnel, heading N.E. No Ch this day.

Saturday Sept 3rd These 24 hours commences with fresh gales from N. with rainy weather, a ruff sea, at mid night more moderate, the wind hauled to West, were ship and headed up S.W. by S. with squalls of rain, Latter parts the same, at 6 A.M. set the jib. No Ch this day.

Sunday Sept 4th These 24 hours commences with fresh gales and cloudy weather, at 3 P.M. saw a Bark running before the gale, at 4 P.M. took in the jib, at 5 saw a sail to the windward standing to the leeward supposed her to be a Schooner, Middle parts more moderate, Latter parts the gale increased and hauled to the West, at half past 1 A.M. made the Island of Tristan da Cunha the N.E. point bearing S.W. by compass distant 12 miles, at 9 squared away and set the square sail, at 11 squared away the gale and split the head of the sail, got up another and set it. Lat Ch 35. 35.

Monday Sept 5th These 24 hours commences with fresh gales and squally weather, Middle parts more moderate a ruff sea, Latter parts the same, at 8 A.M. set the try sail, and kept her off to keep her steady. Lat Ch 35. 25. S.

Tuesday Sept 6th These 24 hours commences with fresh breezes cloudy weather, at half past 5 P.M. took in the main sail and try sail, a heavy S.E. swell, Middle parts, fresh gales attended with rain, Latter parts cloudy at 8 P.M. took in jib and try sail, and set the square sail, ends clear the wind N.W. blowing heavy. Lat Ch 36. 04.

Wednesday Sept 7th These 24 hours commences with fresh gales from N. with rain, at 4 P.M. took in the square sail and have her to under the try sail, with a ruff sea, Middle parts squalls of hail and rain, Latter parts the wind hauled to S.W. and continues to blow. No Ch this day.

Friday Sept 9th These 24 hours commences fresh gales from S.W. and squally, at 5 P.M. wore ship, and set the jib heading S.E. Middle parts moderate with cloudy weather, Latter parts, light breezes from N.W. at 9 A.M. set the main sail, and square sail, ends the same. Lat Ch 35. 44.

Saturday Sept 10th These 24 hours commences with light breezes and variable, Middle parts fresh breezes from N.W. with rain, Latter parts, the wind hauled seaward to the N.W. took in the square sail, wore ship, and reefed the main sail, ends pleasant opened a barrel of pork. Lat Ch 36. 12.

Sunday Sept 11th These 24 hours commences with fresh breezes from N.W. with pleasant weather, Middle parts variable Latter parts light airs and calm. No Ch this day.

Monday Sept 12th These 24 hours commences with calm weather, Middle parts light breezes from E by N. Latter parts fine breezes from N. with pleasant weather, employed hatching out and filling up with water, ends pleasant all sail set to the best advantage. Lat Ch 35. 33.

Tuesday Sept 13th These 24 hours commences with fine breezes from N. with pleasant weather, Middle parts moderate and variable, Latter parts fine steady breezes from N.W. and pleasant all sail set. Lat Ch 37. 11.

Wednesday Sept 14th These 24 hours commences with fine steady breezes from N.W. and pleasant weather, Middle parts light with a smooth sea, Latter parts the same all drawing sail set. Lat Ch 37. 11.

Thursday Sept 15th These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes from N.W. with pleasant weather. Middle parts thick weather at mid night spoke a Bark Ship from Rotterdam, bound to Batavia, and went on board, Latter parts, more moderate all sail set to the best advantage, ends calm. Lat Ch 37. 54 S.

Friday Sept 16th These 24 hours commences with pleasant weather and calm, Middle parts moderate breezes from N.W. with a smooth sea, Latter parts light breezes and variable, two sails in sight, all drawing sail set, ends with moderate breezes and pleasant weather. Lat Ch 37. 10.

Saturday Sept 17th These 24 hours commences with fine pleasant weather, the winds variable with a smooth sea at 2 P.M. the water discoloured, the old sun's lower limb, the longitude reduced to noon by the latitude, was 17. 29. at 4 P.M. took in the square sail, Middle parts fresh breezes from south with squalls of rain, Latter parts more moderate, ends clear all drawing sail set. Lat Ch 37. 42.

Sunday Sept 18th These 24 hours commences with light airs and cloudy weather, Middle parts calm, at 1 A.M. moderate breezes from the N.W. set the square sail, Latter parts fresh breezes at 6 A.M. jibed ship, and reefed the main sail, ends moderate gales with a ruff sea. Lat Ch 38. 15. by D.R. 38. 17 S.

Monday Sept 19th These 24 hours commences with fresh gales from N.W. with rain squalls, at half past 12 P.M. took in the main sail, and ran under the square sail, Middle parts the wind hauled to the west. Latter parts more moderate, at 6 A.M. set the main sail, ends moderate gales from N.W. and pleasant a ruff sea, at meridian took in the main sail. Lat Ch 38. 04 S. Lat D. R. 38. 10.
