Commenced with strong breezes from N W with a tremendous sea on steering S E by E about an old frigate but a new one show finbacks and porpoises middle of day on full took in main gallant sail Doubtless next the topsails at 4 AM a heavy sea leaving from West & S W have to under a close reef main sail on the Starboard took at 9 AM and a most tremendous heavy swell seemed as though it would blow every thing out of her at 10 took in the maintop sail laying under a main sprit last part very heavy gales with a tremendous sea on ship leaving here

Sunday Nov 5th

Came with tremendous gales from West heading up East by N of to S E then the night had some of the most violent squalls that I ever experienced with large quantities of hail attached with lightning occasionally at 8 AM gale abated set Doubtless next Topsails up off steering S E by E last part moderate gales and clear weather turned the reefs and the main Top sail set main gallant sail

Begins with light gales and clear weather from N W steering E S E at night squally attended with rain last part fresh gales and clear with a heavy sea on

Begins with moderate breezes from N W with a tremendous swell leaving from the westward but a new frigate ^{seen} one sail in sight heading the same way saw finbacks & porpoises at 5 AM saw two Wright whale, came got fast to one killed took him along side last part light breezes from West with a heavy swell on

Friday Nov 10th

Came with light breezes from west with a heavy swell on sent the Cuttyger boat out the whale in before the sea show plenty of finbacks there the night calmer AM started the warble last part moderate breezes from N W steering E S E saw thousands of finbacks

Saturday Nov 11th

Came with fresh breezes from N W steering E S E saw finbacks employed wiping out middle and last part winds from N W to S W
