Tuesday Nov 14th

Come with light breeze from West cleared off pleasant steering E.S.E. thru the night strong breeze A.M. moderate trouble with an Stationer about taking his wheel he took up a stick of wood to strike my Sixant mate last part fresh breeze with a heavy sea heaving from N.W. Thus Ends

Wednesday Nov 15th

Come with strong breeze & squally weather from the Northward steering S.E. by E thru the night heavy rains wind hauld to the Southward heading East Thus Ends No Obser

Thursday Nov 16th

Come with fresh breeze from South heading East saw firebricks at 6 P.M. Double reef the topsails middle blow fresh with thunder and lightning took in fore topsails close reef the main A.M. weather more moderate wind hauld S.W. set Double reef topsails jib and mainsail last part fresh gales and clear weather Thus Ends The Day

Begins with fresh breeze from N.W. steering S.E. by E thru the night fresh gales took in gallantails Double reef the topsails latter part heavy gales with sun rain clear with the topsails Thus Ends No Altitude

Sunday Nov 19th

Come with heavy gales from N.W. with sun rain steering S.E. by E under close reef topsails at 6 P.M. took in fore topsails blow on tremendous heavy at 8 have to under bare poles midnight tremendous heavy gales with squalls so powerful cut every thing before them last part heavy gales & clear weather ship rolling very heavy Thus Ends

Lat 36.20 Long 52.10

Monday Nov 20th

Come with heavy gales from N.W. lying to under a main spencer at 4 P.M. gale abated set close reef topsails foremast steering E.S.E. middle and last part light breeze and pleasant weather set all sail Thus Ends

Lat 35.58 Long 54.15

Tuesday November 21st

Come with light breeze from S.W. steering S.E. by E with all sail set towards night calm at 10 fresh breeze from N.W. set topmast and fore Studding sail last part light gales and pleasant Thus Ends

Lat 36.00 Long 57.15

Wednesday Nov 22nd

Begins with light gales from N.W. steering S.E. by E and in Studding sails at night blow on fresh took in top gallantails Double reef topsails last part fresh gales & rainy weather Thus Ends No Obser
