men employed in duties of the ship This Ends Logging at 1000

Thursday March 1st

Commences with pleasant weather last part rainy in places
going off wood This Ends Logging at 1000

Friday March 2nd

Begins with rainy weather got everything about ready
for sea got the pilot aboard how short to get under
way Chain got foul of a rock broke the windlass
got a line a Haul Thru the chain clear of the rock
at 4 P.M. got underway with a light breeze off shore
got out side of the reef true away calm I left

George Coon an Irishman & Henry Williams behind
Deserted from me and glad to get rid of them so

This Ends Log by 149 12

Saturday March 3rd By lunar Ob 149 45

All these 24 hours calm weather Camp being S.E. dist
15 miles sent a boat in shore after the two Deserters
but heard nothing from them Ship Hellasport got underway
I came out the two 5 men runaway This Ends
Observe by the time 5:40 P.M.

Sunday March 4th

Begins with light breeze from South steering N by E in
company with ship Hellasport threw the night light over
from East heading N by E last part light hazy winds
and squally This Ends

Lat 16-28 Long 150-24

Monday March 5th

Begins with light breeze from South weather middle
calm last part fresh breeze from N by E heading N by E

This Ends

Lat 16-45

Lat 16-20 Long 150-08

Born for Japan

Tuesday March 6th

Came with fresh breeze from N by E heading N by E
at night squally with in gullantails last part light breeze
from North latter ship heading N by E This Ends

Lat 15-41 Long 149-16

Wednesday March 7th

Came with light breeze from North heading N by E
the rest part of these 24 hours weather the same This Ends

Lat 14-27 Long 148-30

Thursday March 8th

Came with light breeze from E by N heading N by E
Hellasport remains in sight middle and last part fine
breeze & pleasant weather This Ends

Lat 12-37 Long 149-30

Friday March 9th

Begins with light breeze from E by N heading N by E
Dear Sea away calm thunder with squalls and rain
with thunder & lightning I held the ship what not every
thing but a fair wind I that I never expect to get
again middle heavy squalls with rain with tremendous
heavy thunder and sharp lightning last part heavy rain
with squalls from every point of the compass

This Ends Observe

By Sec Lat 12-30 Long 149-28

Saturday March 10th

Came with the heaviest weather at 1 P.M. had a
tremendous heavy squall ~~calm~~ all hands cleared
up and cleared down everything rain hard enough
to prevent the force above threw the night heavy rain squalls
last part clear off light breeze from N by E heading N by E

This Ends

Lat 12-08 Long 149-38

Sunday March 11th

Came with light breeze from N by E heading N by E as far
as breeze I a fair wind I never expect to have middle
and last part squally attended with rain

Returned to the vessel

Deserted off July
