Sunday Apr 29th  
Came with fresh breezes and smoky weather  
wind south steering N<sup>W</sup> with all sail set  
at night baffling wind attended with rain at 12  
wind hauled out from the Northward soon increased  
to a gale more ship heading N<sup>W</sup> took in jib  
& maintail foretopail Double reef the main  
last part weather more moderate set the topsails  
Double reef This Ends No Observ  
By Ace Lat 32.36 Long 153.00

Monday Apr 30th  
Came with light gales from N<sup>E</sup> steering N<sup>W</sup>  
at 2 P.M. made all sail at 6 P.M. took in gallants  
last part fresh breezes and pleasant weather Ends  
Lat 35.8 Long 153.38

Tuesday May 1st  
Began with fresh breezes from E N<sup>E</sup> steering  
N<sup>W</sup> with all sail set sent down the main  
royal yard & gallant studding sail booms  
threw the night strong wind with rain and foggy  
last part wind hauled S E cleared up sun saw  
thousands of whale birds This Ends  
Lat 38.00 Long 152.29

Wednesday May 2nd  
Came with light gales from S E steering N<sup>W</sup>  
took in fore studding sail booms at night blew on  
heavy from the Southward took in sail here to under  
w close reef maintopail heading West at 2 A.M.  
wind hauled out N<sup>W</sup> at 5 A.M. took in the  
Main topail blows on tremendous heavy with  
rough sea on This Ends  
Lat 38.30 Long 152.40

Thursday May 3rd  
Began with ~~fresh~~ heavy gales from N<sup>W</sup>  
heading N<sup>E</sup> by N F.M. weather more  
moderate set the topsails Double reef standing  
to the N<sup>E</sup> saw finbacks Ends  
Lat 38.40 Long 153.05

Friday May 4th  
Came with pleasant breezes from N<sup>W</sup> heading  
N<sup>E</sup> with all sail set saw finbacks threw the  
night wind light and baffling last part light breezes from  
S S<sup>W</sup> steering N<sup>W</sup> saw finbacks Ends  
Lat 39.26 Long 153.25

Saturday May 5th  
Began with moderate breezes from S S<sup>W</sup> steering  
N<sup>W</sup> saw finbacks ordered the studding sail  
stowed them below at 4 P.M. saw a Brig steering N<sup>E</sup>  
with all sail set middle strong breezes & rainy Double  
reef the topsails last part calm saw a school  
of blackfish bore and got one of my Gards broke  
off lowering down This Ends  
Lat 41.00 Long 153.05

Sunday May 6th  
Came with light breeze from East and pleasant  
weather steering N<sup>W</sup> A.M. foggy last part fresh  
breezes from S E with heavy rain and thick fog took  
in sail here to heading E N<sup>E</sup> This Ends No Observ  
By Ace Lat 42.10 Long 150.30

Monday May 7th  
Began with fresh breezes from South with heavy rain  
and thick fog heading E S E at night cleared off light breezes  
from N S<sup>W</sup> last part light breeze from west and thick  
foggy This Ends  
By Ace Lat 42.41 Long 150.50
