 Begins with light breezes from the southward
 with heavy rains and plenty of fog at 6 P.M.
 Tied away cabin attended with thick fog at 12 fresh
 breezes from N.W. with frequent squalls at 4
 A.M. let Double reef to sails heading West
 last part rough weather with snow squalls saw fishback
 This Ends The Day
 Lat 45.49 Long 131.21

Thursday May 24th
 Begins with gales from the northward heading N.W. 11
 Saw right whale to rough to low at 8 am ship heading
 N.E. at 3 A.M. taken heading N.W. 11 saw two right
 whale bones did not get first but part light
 breezes and cloudy
 This Ends
 Lat 45.48 Long 131.21

Friday May 25th
 Begins with pleasant breezes from the northward
 Saw three right whale bones went on to one and a half
 saw two more went on with the other success while
 with one all heading in for the land then the night
 calm A.M. light breeze from the southward steering South
 for Moroccan Island This Ends N. Atlantic
 By day Lat 46.33 Long 131.45

Saturday May 26th
 Begins with light breezes from the southward steering North
 at 6 P.M. wind hauled S.E. saw Moroccan Island bearing
 West dist 20 miles took ship heading of those hours
 on heavy with snow rain and fog. Meted up together
 ship heading South carrying all the canvas the well
 bore to work off shore at 12 wind hauled East steering heavy
 with a tremendous sea bearing from S.E. ship heading
 up S.E. took in gallantails double reef the
 captain took in 1st 4th 6th gale abate wind hauled S.W.
 chair up made all sail steering N.W. at 12 saw Moroccan Island
 bearing N.W. dist 20 miles Lat 46.40 Long 133.00
 Chronometer 90 miles out of the way by the
 land

Sunday May 27th
 Begins with strong breezes from South S.W. heading
 in for Moroccan Island at 4 P.M. took ship working
 to windward to get in to the passage then the night light
 and from South and calm at 4 A.M. strong breeze sprang
 up from N.W. which soon increased to a gale took in
 top gallantails at 8 A.M. double reef the sails saw
 Homer or torrey Island bearing North dist 10 miles wave
 ship heading N.W. at 12 saw Moroccan Island bearing
 N.W. dist 12 miles last part fresh gales with snow rain
 and fog
 Lat By Double reef 46.45 Long 134.21

Monday May 28th
 Begins with fresh gales from N.W. with snow and
 fog with tremendous heavy squalls off the land heading
 N.W. under close reef main topsail and fore sail at 6
 Moroccan Island bore N.W. dist 13 miles at 10 hip off shore
 steering S.E. till 4 and bore to last part heavy gales
 with snow
 This Ends N. Atlantic
 By day Lat 46.50 Long 131.40

Tuesday May 29th
 Begins with fresh gales from N.W. bore to heading
 N.W. at 12 weather moderate wind hauled North
 made all sail bore for the Cebrato Sea the fourth time that
 I have had a trial at 6 A.M. saw Moroccan Island
 bearing West dist 13 miles last part calm and foggy
 saw a ship bore in This Ends
 Lat 46.46 Long 131.12

Wednesday May 30th
 Begins with light baffling wind from every point of the
 compass attended with fog at 8 P.M. South End of
 Moroccan Island bore N.W. North dist 12 miles saw
 a ship to be seen working up wind west then the night
 fresh breezes from N.W. came all but beating up in to the
 passage at 3 A.M. Moroccan Island South End bore West
 dist 6 miles took ship heading off till 8 calm and stood
 in again at 12 Moroccan Island South End bore E. 1/2 E
 dist 13 miles one ship in sight bore in This Ends
 Lat 46.41 Long 133.26
