

Bark Shepherdeff - Norwalk

Saturday June 30th

Begins with fresh breezes from S.W.
Laying blubber bogged with a whale long side
broke out all slow down 150 bbl oil last
part part calm weather and pleasant

Thus Ends
Lat 37° 7' Long 159° 15'

Sunday July 1st

Begins with calm weather in places
flowing water and starting head S.W.
cut the whale in

Thus Ends
Lat 37° 20' Long 159° 41'

Monday July 2nd

Begins with light airs from the Eastward
steering to the Westward at 5 A.M. spoke ship
Marble of Haver 2 years out 24 hundred bbls
spoke ship Marred two whale then being
to fairhaven

Thus Ends
Lat 37° 37' Long 151° 41'

Tuesday July 3rd

Begins with fine weather wind from
the Eastward steering to the westward 8 ships
in sight at 4 P.M. broke out the fore piece slow
down the oil Saw two ships cutting

Thus Ends
Lat 37° 11' Long 150° 29'

Wednesday July 4th

Begins with calm weather and pleasant
three Shepletop whale going quick to the Eastward
bowed went in to two and killed one but in
light middle calm last part light airs from
the westward 6 sail in sight Saw nothing

Thus Ends
Lat 37° 27' Long 150° 11'

Cruising for whale when ever I
can find them

Thursday July 5th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the
westward heading S.W. at 3 P.M. saw
saw 4 Shepletop whale bowed got fast
to one I went on to him and killed
him he let off slow the hull
bottom of the boat in the mate
took my boat aboard I got in to the
whale boat bowed the whale up took him
long side 4 ships in sight At 4 rough weather
wind west out the whale in to toward me before
it 8 ships in sight sum of them bailing
Saw sum of them whaling

Thus Ends 10th
By Dec Lat 37° 5' Long 150° 13'

Friday July 6th

Begins with rough weather wind West and clear
got the whale cut in clear up chaps set the fore
a going again 3 sail in sight middle fresh gales
last part calm 4 sail in sight

Thus Ends
Lat 37° 27' Long 149° 37'

Saturday July 7th

Begins with calm weather At 10 slow
down 150 bbl oil in the forehole carpenter
employed mending the May hat

Thus Ends
Lat 37° 34' Long 149° 00'

Sunday July 8th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southward
heading S.W. at 2 P.M. in sight at 3 P.M.
spoke ship Marred 6 whale
last part moderate breezes from S.W. heading
S.E. saw one Shepletop going quick to
the westward bowed saw some of him

Thus Ends
Lat 37° 25' Long 148° 30'
