 2500 lbs and Hountess New Bedford 2400 lbs
 bones South threw the night foggy last
 part cleared up made sail saw nothing but
 of steering S E

 Southward with sun foggy at 4 P.M. saw one
 Shephardess going quick S E breeze did not
 get past threw the night foggy S W cleared up

 oil 300 lbs taken out of the Tanks Thus Ends
 Lat 37.00 Long 132.20

 hole his iron till the whale got out of the way
 middle and last part light breezes from S W alternated

 knocked it down Thus Ends No Observation

Saturday July 14th
 Begins with light breezes from S W and thick foggy
 Cooper employed repairing calk middle and last part
 foggy as usual wind South steering East
 Thus Ends No Observation
 By Sec Lat 37.35 Long 136.00

 Begins with fresh breezes from South and foggy steering
 East at 6 P.M. cleared up spoke Ship Eric of
 Fair Haven baiting 13 whale this morn at night
 blow fresh attended with thick fog at 11 took in the
 forebatch close right the main batch hauled down to on the
 forebatch took middle blow down with a rough sea
 on last part gale shifted down with a tremendous sea
 on and thick fog wind S S W Thus Ends No Observation
 By Sec Lat 38.10 Long 135.20

Monday July 16th
 Coin with fresh gales from S W with a rough sea
 saw ship heading S E middle blow on fresh attended
 with thick foggy saw a ship heading to the Westward
 under close reef topsails at 4 P.M. saw a ship heading
 west at 6 P.M. saw ship heading west set the fore sail
 last part gale abated saw thousands of porpoises
 one sail in sight heading S E Thus Ends
 No Observations
