New Bedford 12 bells at night took in sail wind S.E. with
thick fog at 6 A.M. cleared up some made sail last
part ~~last~~ blow fresh from South took in sail

again for fog heading S.E. at 12 wind hauled N.W. took in

Monday Sept 17th
Begins with pleasant buses from North steering South
went on board Ship Tuscarora had a gunn then the night calm
last part light buses from South saw nothing Thus Ends

Tuesday Sept 18th
Begins with light bus and calm weather two sails in sight
last part fresh gales from N.E. and clear weather saw frigate
Thus Ends The Day

Wednesday Sept 19th
Begins with fresh gales from N.E. and clear weather
steering S.W. two frigates at 4 P.M. saw a ship
under double reef Topham heading to the Northward
at night took in sail heading to the Northward last
part fresh gales from S.E. and clear weather Thus Ends
Lat 47-40 Long 148-01

Thursday Sept 20th
Begins with fresh gales from S.E. and clear weather
heading S.W. middle in last part moderate gales from South
attended with rain
Thus Ends No Obv
