

Burgin Shepherd's Voyage

Friday September 21st

Begins with moderate breeze from the Southward attended with fog heading E S & middle calm last part light breeze from S E. Steering S & saw pinbacks. Thus Ends Observation.
By Sec Lat 48° 00' Long 149° 00'.

Saturday September 22nd

Begins with pleasant breeze from S E steering S & saw a Sulphur bottom took it to be a right whale heard did not get fast last part calm pleasant weather appears an old top sail bent it for a main sail. Thus Ends The Day.
Lat 47° 37' Long by the 149° 27'.
By Lunar Obs 149° 03'.
Chromometer reads 5° 28' to be added.

Sunday Sept 23rd

Calm with light air from West and pleasant weather steering S & middle and last part calm saw pinbacks and Lumpsbacks saw Broughtons Round Island having S E and last 50 miles. Thus Ends The Day.
Lat 47° 22' Long 149° 51'.

Monday

Tuesday Sept 24th

Commences with light air from S E heading E S & saw Moricean Island having E S & dist 60 miles at 5 P.M. took a ship heading S S W middle and last part fresh gales from S E two sails in sight. Thus Ends The Day.
Lat 47° 22' Long 149° 53'.

After Tuesday Sept 25th

Begins with gales from S E heading S W at 2 P.M. moderate breeze from East saw three right whale to southwest going quick N E & were ship made all sail that for them they soon went out of sight of the ship at night foggy light wind from East heading S by E blew the night fresh breeze from S W at 12 line a back last part fresh gales from N E W up off S E for Moricean Island. Thus Ends.
Lat 47° 11' Long 151° 31'.

Wednesday Sept 26th

Begins with moderate breeze from West steering East at 6 P.M. spoke ship South Western fair haven 2100 lbs at night double reef the top sail heading to the Westward at 10 wind hauled N W were ship heading N S W at 6 A.M. saw Broughtons Round Island having South dist 10 miles made all sail left off steering S E three ships in sight bound out. Thus Ends The Day.
Lat 46° 41' Long 151° 49'.

Thursday September 27th

Begins with pleasant breeze from West steering E S & saw plenty of pinbacks and two right whale going quick towards the land saw ship Nova Scotia bound out middle fresh gales from N W steering E S & double reef the top sail four or five squalls attended with sharp lightning fast part fresh gales & clear weather. Thus Ends.
Lat 45° 51' Long 155° 30'.

Friday Sept 28th

Calm with fresh gales from S W steering East with hale top sails. Set middle weather about the same last part weather more moderate. Set all sail saw a ship steering E S &. Thus Ends The Day.
Lat 45° 28' Long 159° 11'.

Saturday Sept 29th

Begins with fresh breeze from S W steering East with all sail set middle and last part fresh gales and squally weather. Thus Ends. No observations.
Lat 45° 30' Long by Sec 163° 00'.

Sunday Sept 30th

Begins with fresh gales from West steering East middle weather more moderate wind with last part fresh breeze from S E. Thus Ends.
Lat 44° 51' Long by Sec 166° 00'.
