Begins with fresh gales from S W steering E S E with all sail set middle squally last part light breezes & pleasant weather

Monday Oct 15th

Commences with moderate breezes from West steering E S E with all sail set middle fresh gales from South Double reef the topsails took in jib & mainmast at 2 P.M. took in foretopmast blows on heavy S S took in the foresail hove to under a close reef main & forepart gale increasing at 7 bells S S took in mainmast blows on tremendous head in squalls attended with heavy rain last part cleared up gale hauled to West ship rolling heavily a high sea running

Tuesday Oct 16th

Came with heavy gales from West with a high sea barometer standing at 29 inches at 4 P.M. gale abated set the topsails close reefed hove off E S E middle and last part strong gales shuddering under Double reef topsails

Wednesday Oct 17th

Begins with strong gales from West steering E S E under Double reef topsails middle heavy squalls last part moderate gales with a high sea on

Came with gales from West steering E S E middle squally attended with rain last part moderate breezes and cloudy

Friday Oct 19th

Came with moderate breezes from S W steering S E saw a school of blackfish hauled did not get fast on board the Mainmast bent a sho one middle and last part light and and calm weather one sail in sight

Saturday Oct 20th

Begins with light breeze from E N E and pleasant weather steering S E one sail in sight ahead middle and last part winds from S E heading S S W

Thus Ends The Day

Lat 33-26 Long 157-40

Sunday Oct 21st

Came with light breezes from S S E tackles ship heading E by S one sail in sight middle and last part baffling winds with heavy rain squalls

Thus Ends M. Chase

By Sec Lat 33-03 Long 156-05

Monday Oct 22nd

Came with light breezes from the southward heading E S E last part wind hauled round to North in a heavy rain squall one sail in sight

By Sec Lat 32-30 Long 155-50

Tuesday Oct 23rd

Begins with moderate breezes from N N E attended with frequent rain squalls steering S S E with all sail set one sail in sight ahead steering the same course middle and last part baffling winds with squalls and heavy rain
