Thursday Jan 18th

Came with calm weather attended with rain  
Morse Baring N.E. Dist 18 miles threw the night  
calm last part fine weather cooking the wood  
repaired the bunnings hung it again Cooper employed  
setting up pots to put water in Thus Ends

Friday January 19th

Begins with calm weather men employed in  
dies of the ship threw the night winds from  
every point of the compass with plenty of rain  
Thus Ends

Saturday Jan 20th

This day came with fine weather Cooper employed  
setting up pots last part strong winds saw a  
ship steering to the southward Cooper and men  
employed heaving the cables for rafting Thus Ends

Sunday Jan 21st

Commences with fresh winds and pleasant weather  
at 4 P.M. got the chains up and bent them mowed  
anchorage having N.E. Dist 10 miles threw the  
night pleasant weather with land breezes at 8 A.M. it came  
to anchor one french whaler laying her and 8  
small craft besides Thus Ends

Monday Jan 22nd

Came with fresh winds breezes from the westward  
health officer came here informed me potatoes & salt  
barrel other things in proportion last part fresh  
breezes with a heavy swell in front the water  
hushed on shore Thus Ends

## Laying at anchor at Howee

Tuesday Jan 23rd

Begins with calm weather with a heavy  
swell on at night got a raft of water  
on shore set got one last part fine weather  
all hands employed Towing down water  
Thus Ends

Wednesday Jan 24th

Begins with fine weather all hands employed  
getting off water Richard Riddle and William Gammon  
unmanning Thus Ends

Thursday Jan 25th

All this day fine weather men employed getting  
off water showing it down took 21 fbls meat on shore  
showed it 6 hawks head & flour Thus Ends

Friday Jan 26th

Begins with fine weather got all the water off  
showed it down caught the two runaways took  
them aboard Thus Ends

Saturday Jan 27th

Begins with fine weather got every thing aboard  
ready for sea got 15 fbls potatoes at 60 dollars per  
barrel Thus Ends

Sunday Jan 28th

All these 24 hours fine weather continued  
Joseph Brown in view for attempting to swim  
on shore set to take them off it 11 A.M. got under  
way and went to sea Thus Ends

Monday Jan 29th

Begins with fresh winds and pleasant  
weather doubled with the topsails at 1 P.M. Breeze  
West End Bore S.W. Dist 8 miles by observation  
Chauvinette 6:30 A.M. to show from the night strong  
breezes last part pleasant weather Thus Ends
