Begins with calm and rain with a rough sea on

at 8 P.M. came on tremendous heavy squalls were
ship took in the maintop sail ship heading west
at night gale abated a high sea on ship rolling very
heavy till calm last part fresh breezes from South steering
West

Monday Feb 27th

Friday March 1st

Came with fresh gales from N.W. with a high sea heading
N.W. at 1 P.M. set the fore sail then purpussing last part fresh
breezes from the Northward steering West Thus Ends
Lat 31-28 Long 168-45

Saturday March 2nd

Begins with moderate gales from North and clear
weather steering West with double reef topsails last
middle and last part pleasant breezes from East steering West
Thus Ends The Day
Lat 31-48 Long 167-9

Sunday March 3rd

Came with fresh breezes from East and clear weather steering
West at 8 o'clock breeze too heavy from S.E. took in sail
here to make a close reef maintop sail at 8 P.M. blew on
tremendous heavy in squalls with a high sea
took in wash board were ship took in maintop
ail at 11 o'clock hauled West in a tremendous rain squall
with a high sea on ship rolling very heavy took
a drift coaler and Deale knows what next
