Com with pleasant gales from N.E.
steering S.S.E. ship sprung a leak
middle and last part calm employed looking
for the leak could not find it Thus Ends
Lat 29° 15' Long 167° 10'

Thursday March 7th
Com with calm weather thru the night winds
from S.E. with heavy rains last fresh gales from N.W.
Thus Ends
Lat 29° 00' Long 167° 20'

Friday March 8th
Com with fresh gales from N.W. and cloudy weather
last part fresh gales and clear weather set double
reef topsails steered to the eastward Thus Ends
Lat 28° 40' Long 167° 25'

Saturday March 9th
Began with gales from the Northward
with a rough sea Ends with light breezes from S.E.
steering E.N.E. Lat 28° 32' Long 167° 50'

Sunday March 10th
Com with pleasant breezes from S.E. middle fresh
gales from South at 4 P.M. wind hauled N.W. in
a heavy rain squall last part light gales from North
steering East Lat 28° 44' Long 169° 10'

Monday March 11th
Com with moderate breezes from the Northward
steering East saw nothing last part light gales
from S.E. steering North saw plenty of porpoises
Thus Ends
Lat 28° 50' Long 169° 20'

Cruising for Whales

Tuesday March 12th
Com with pleasant gales from S.E. steering
North with double reef topsails set saw porpoises
at night took in sail heading N.E. thru the night
winds variable with heavy rains last part fresh gales
from South with a heavy atmosphere Ends No. 10
By day Lat 29° 15' Long 169° 30'

Wednesday March 13th
Began with fresh gales from South and cloudy
at 4 P.M. wind hauled N.W. in a heavy rain squall
middle and last part moderate breezes and clear weather
saw plenty of porpoises Thus Ends the Day
Lat 29° 32' Long 169° 50'

Thursday March 14th
Began with moderate breezes from the Northward heading
N.W. saw porpoises employed making a line
flying jib last part light breezes from N.E. and pleasant
weather saw plenty of porpoises Thus Ends
Lat 29° 35' Long 169° 55'

Friday March 15th
Commenced with pleasant weather with winds from N.E. steer-
ing N.W. saw porpoises and thousand birds
last part fresh breezes from S.E. saw finbacks
employed making a flying jib Thus Ends
Lat 30° 32' Long 169° 52'

Saturday March 16th
Began with fresh breezes from S.E. steering N.W. saw finbacks
thru the night part gales took in the jib sail set
last part moderate gales from South made sail steering N.W.
Thus Ends No. 10
Lat 31° 17' Long 170° 00'

Sunday March 17th
Began with cloudy weather wind from the Southward at 4 P.M.
wind hauled N.W. in a thunder squall took in sail last part
fresh gales from N.W. with clear weather Thus Ends
Lat 30° 50' Long 170° 10'
