Tuesday April 30th

Corn with light breezes from West steering N by E at 8 P.M. saw one right whale bore did not get fast at night calm At 10 fresh breezes from N.E. saw two right whale bore did not get fast came back in sail last part heavy gales every thing gave up This Ends N. B. 175-31

Wednesday May 1st

Begins with heavy gales from N.E. attended with frequent snowsqualls ice making all over the ship midline and last part fresh gales from N.W. in a rough sea on Lat 57° 30' Long 174° 00'

Thursday May 2nd

Corn with fresh gales from N.W. heading North saw one whale took it to be a right whale last part moderate breezes from S.E. steering N by E entered the main sail bent a new one Ends Lat 58° 15' Long 175° 50'

Friday May 3rd

Corn with light breezes from East steering N by E at 2 P.M. saw one right whale going quick to the southward saw large body of ice having West back up N.E. to clear it saw fish-backs threw the night calm last part light breezes from West saw nothing This Ends Lat 58° 50' Long 174° 25'

Saturday May 4th

Begins with pleasant breezes from West steering N.E. by N. midline and last part fresh gales from S.W. saw thousands of whale ribs This Ends Lat 60° 00' Long 175° 30'

## Bound for the Sea of Anadior

Sunday May 5th

Corn with gales from S.W. attended with frequent snowsqualls steering N.E. & saw one fin back one thousands of whale ribs threw the night plenty of snow saw a polar whale in the night at 4 A.M. saw large body of field ice were ship heading to the southward saw two polar whale bore did not get fast saw another to far off to bear Lat 60° 45' Long 179° 38'

Monday May 6th

Corn with light breeze from the Northward heading N.E. at 2 P.M. saw one polar whale bore got fast took him long ice at 6 P.M. commenced cutting took his chest and lips in to heavy snow on let the rest be till morning cut the whale in started the works last part fine weather light breeze from N.E. saw large body of ice running S.E. by N.W. This Ends Lat 60° 56' Long 179° 44'

Tuesday May 7th

Corn with light breeze from N.E. at 6 P.M. saw one polar whale going quick S.E. saw hells through the night light breeze from N.E. heading E.S.E. at 10 A.M. shot to the ice ship off steering West saw the land but no whale Ends Lat 60° 54' Long 178° 38'

Wednesday May 8th

Corn with pleasant breezes from N.W. & heading N.N.W. quitted the bone and cleane At last part wind and weather the same saw two polar whale bore far him went in to the ice saw numbers of him plenty of ice in sight This Ends Lat 60° 26' Long 178° 00'
