Wednesday May 29th
 Begins with light breezes from East attended with fog
 and snow at 4 P.M. cleared up for a while 6 ships in
 sight last part heavy gales from N.E. attended with
 thick fog Thus Ends No Obsr

Friday May 31st
 Begins with heavy gales from North heading E.N.E.
 middle and last part weather the same no sail in

Saturday June 1st
 Begins with fresh gales from North at 4 P.M.
 saw ship heading N.W. by W last part light breeze
 and pleasant weather three sails in sight Thus Ends No Obsr

Sunday June 2nd
 Com with light breeze from North heading E.N.E. at
 night calm and pleasant last part light breeze from

 running thru ice lumps larger than the
 ship found the boat took the whale by
 side ship surrounded with ice made
