Wednesday June 12th

Begins with light gales from S.W.

the land saw nothing Thus Ends  
Lat 63-55 Long 179-50

Thursday June 13th

Begins with strong breezes from S.E. at night  
Shows on heavy clouds begin the rain but at last past  
strong gales from South ahead up a while saw 8 ships  
the saw two steering N.W. finished boiling & ends the  
By Ace Lat 63-15 Long 178-20

Friday June 14th

Commences with fresh gales from South heading  
E.S.E. three ships in sight at night shows  
on heavy attended with thick fog took in  
the forenoon but part weather more moderate fresh  
and the night later between decks down the  
oil Thus Ends No Observ  
By Ace Lat 63-23 Long 178-00

Saturday June 15th

Begins with fresh gales from South  
Heading E.S.E. finished blowing down the oil  
middle and last part weather more moderate  
made sail saw nothing but ships saw plenty  
of them heading N.W. Thus Ends  
Lat 63-12 Long 175-00

# Cruising for Whale in Sea of Anad

Sunday June 16th

Begins with strong breezes from S.W.  
Steering North the land about 50 miles  
spoke ship Tiger Stonington two whale  
and ship Maylow New Bedford & whale  
at night carried sail heading to the westward  
last part light air and pleasant weather so ships  
in sight saw number of whale all going quick  
fry Thus Ends  
Lat 64-10 Long 175-12  
By Ace Lat 64-00 Long 175-40

Monday June 17th

Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. steering East  
along with the land saw whale going S.W. 19 ships  
in sight at 8 A.M. Cape North saw North East 10  
St Lawrence Island low East about 10 miles  
were ship heading N.W. spoke ship William  
Bell Saghar bar & whale saw two whale going  
quick S.W. last part strong breezes from South  
Thus Ends No Observ

Tuesday June 18th

Begins with strong breezes from South heading  
N.W. at night shows on heavy from S.E. heading  
East land East 15 miles carrying a heavy breeze of  
sail to crowd off shore at 3 P.M. boat has done  
to double reef & sails jib and main sail blown  
on heavy with a tremendous sea so at 4 o'clock & broke  
of water on deck to sea has as much as possible  
has making a down heave and has at 12 wind last  
S.W. ship heading up S.E. took in jib and  
main sail and foremast. last part moderate breeze  
from South with fog a heavy sail on  
Thus Ends No Observations
