Friday June 28th

Begins with light breeze from East and pleasant weather but part pleasant breezes from South were employed in duties of the ship saw Bark Columbia Sigharhar sailing. Thus Ends
Lat 63-12 Long 177-50

Saturday June 29th

Came with light breezes from South and pleasant weather heading West all hands employed cooping the oil but part light breezes and pleasant weather. Thus Ends
Lat 63-14 Long 177-20

Sunday June 30th

Begins with pleasant breeze from S.E. saw plenty of whale got part to me took him by side threw down twelve casks of oil in the blubber room commenced cutting one of the forewings faster than eleven came oblique piece and all cut his badly in and lost the rest go last part three gales from South the weather most awful heavy rains and fog. Thus Ends
By Sea Lat 63-30 Long 178-00

Monday July 1st

Begins with fresh gales from South and S.E. attended with heavy rains the weather most hard deck full of oil and blubber and other rubbish Spoke Ship Starb. New Bedford 1000 lbs of oil last part weather about the same wind hauled S.E. attended with plenty of rain and snow. Thus Ends

Brind for Arctic July 1857

Tuesday July 2nd

Begins with fresh gales from N.E. attended with heavy snows and rain top of South much above rest. Started sail job and Spoke at 6 P.M. so swift here to make a chase very maintained part of ship laying to set her pilot signal whist over line last part weather more moderate. Started the work cleared up some saws ship saw one take a whale last part fresh breezes from S.E. and ship heading N.E. by compass. Thus Ends
By Sea Lat 63-11 Long 178-20

Wednesday July 3rd

Begins with fresh breezes from East S.E. heading N.E. the weather fair partly rain raising last part light breezes from North attended with rain saw Ship America. New London sailing broke out the gun late stood down part of the oil. Thus Ends
Lat 63-45 Long 178-30

Thursday July 4th

Begins with light breeze from North attended with foggy and rain middle calm last part light breezes from S.E. cleared up for a while saw Cape Thaddeus dist 20 miles 3 ships in sight saw one eating saw number of whale. Thus Ends
Lat 63-30 Long 178-30

Friday July 5th

Begins with light breezes from S.E. spoke Ship Starb. Cold Spring 1500 lbs this morn. at night calm last part weather the same fire all the baskets bore tubs of blubber water checked the blubber room off with oil. Thus Ends
By Sea Lat 63-10 Long 178-40
