Saturday Oct 26<sup>th</sup>

Came with light breezes from S.W. and pleasant weather steering East with all sail set at eight strong breezes from the Southward took in studding sails steering E by N last part light gales and clear weather

Sunday Oct 27

Begins with strong breezes from South steering E by S with all sail set midnight and haul E by S heading N E last part light baffling winds from the Eastward

Thus Ends The Day

Monday Oct 28

Came with light baffling winds from East heading N E by S at 4 P.M. took in ship heading S by E headwinds and never expect to get a fair wind middle wine and weather the same last part fresh breezes and squally weather Double reef the topsails

Tuesday Oct 29

Fresh breezes from E.S.E. and squally weather heading N E by S with Double reef topsails set middle fresh gales took in jib and mainmast fore topsails last part fresh gales and rainy weather

Wednesday Oct 30

Begins with strong gales from the Eastward and dark dirty rainy weather took in foresail at 6 P.M. took in the main topsails at 4 P.M. and hauled to the Southward at 8 P.M. set Double reef topsails ship off steering East last part moderate gales with a rough sea

## Bounder Towards Cape Horn

Thursday Oct 31

Came with moderate gales from West with a rough choppy sea on steering East with all sail set middle fresh gales and variable Double reef the topsails wine hauling to North and back to West last part fine clear gales and pleasant weather

Friday November 1<sup>st</sup>

Begins with fresh gales from S.W. and clear weather with a smooth sea steering E by S with full topsails set middle heavy gales with tremendous squalls close reef the topsails last part weather about the same

Thus Ends  
Lat 41° 36' Long 150° 34'

Saturday Nov 2

Begins with strong gales from S.W. at 1 P.M. had a tremendous squall wine haul west down as if it would blow every thing up by the roots close reef the topsails steering E by S middle and last part fresh gales and clear weather with a high sea

Lat 42° 11' Long 156° 00'

Sunday Nov 3<sup>rd</sup>

Came with fresh gales from West with a high sea steering E by S with Double reef topsails set last part moderate gales with thick weather

Begins with light breezes from West with foggy steering E by S with all sail set the new part of the 24 hours weather the same

Light breezes from west with foggy steering E by S with all sail set studding sails down at midnight wine haul S.W. took in studding sails last part strong gales took in gallies sails Double reef the topsails
