Saturday Sept 27.

Begins with light breeze from East and pleasant weather steering South saw and English ships heading S.E. thru the night fresh breeze last part much lighter. No more to the Northward. Ends lat 28-51 Long 25-51

Sunday Sept 28

Came with pleasant breeze from N.E. steering S by E men employed in duties of the ship last part calm. Ends lat 30-24 Long 25-10

Monday Sept 29

Begins with calm weather and cloudy at night light breeze from E.S.E. heading South last part much the same weather cloudy. Saw finbacks and porpoises. Ends lat 31-13 Long 25-10

Tuesday Sept 30

Came with light breeze from E.S.E. heading South saw finbacks more thickly than last part light breeze from N.W. employed repairing head. Saw finbacks and porpoises. Ends lat 32-41 Long 27-40

Wednesday Sept Oct 1

Came with light breeze from N.W. and pleasant weather steering S.E. saw finbacks employed repairing head middle and last part light breeze from S.E. and cloudy employed repairing the head. Ends lat 34-2 Long 26-20

Thursday Oct 2

Begins with light breeze from the Southward and cloudy heading E.S.E. middle calm last part light breeze from N.W. saw finbacks and thousands of birds. Ends lat 34-35 Long 25-17

Friday Oct 3

Begins with moderate breeze from N.W. steering S.E. saw finbacks men employed repairing foretopmast thru the night strong breeze took in gallantails last part light breeze from S.W. and smoky. Ends lat 33-35 Long 25-10

Saturday Oct 4

Begins with light breeze from S.W. steering S.E. saw finbacks thru the night strong breeze and rainy squalls. Threw the topsails last part heavy gale and squally steering East saw white whale passed. Ends lat 36-49 Long 25-38

Sunday Oct 5

Came with heavy gale from S.W. steering East under double reef topsails at night there is under a close reef main-topmast on the Starboard took blow on very heavy in squally middle and last part weather about the same. Ends lat 36-24 Long 25-30

Monday Oct 6

Begins with heavy gale from S.W. at 2 P.M. rolled away the waist boat could all hands took her in and took away the after stay. At 10 last close reef topsails kept off E.S.E. Ends lat 36-25 Long 24-44

Tuesday Oct 7

Begins with fresh gale from S.W. with a high sea steering E by S last part calm a heavy swell on carpenter employed repairing waist boat. Ends lat 36-4 Long 15-37

Wednesday Oct 8

Begins with calm weather at 4 P.M. light breeze from the Northward steering S by E last part strong gale from N.W. steering S.E. with double reef topsails set. Ends lat 37-50 Long 15-30
