

Ship Cleared New London

Monday Oct 20

Came with fresh gales from South steering S S E under close reef topsails and secured middle weather more moderate but not light air from weather
Ends lat 37.11 long 22.50

Tuesday Oct 21

Begins with light air and variable heading East at night light air from the Eastward till five o'clock East and light heading to the Southward then
finishes
Ends lat 36.46 long 22.51
By fence Order 22.55

Wednesday Oct 22

Came with light air from the Eastward and pleasant weather heading S S E per compass in danger of reefing sails saw finches middle wind light and baffling but not clear saw finches and porpoises
lat 36.55 long 24.34

Thursday Oct 23

Begins with light breezes from S W at 6 P.M. wind hauls South in a heavy squall took in gallant sails and the topsails last part fresh breezes from S E heading E S E made all sail in danger of reefing sails
lat 36.08 long 26.51

Friday Oct 24

Begins with strong breezes from S E heading E S E took in gallant sails at night wind baffling & squally attended with rain one ship middle strong breezes from west attended with lightning and heavy rain squally last part wind S W and squally saw finches
lat 35.59 long 28.41

Bound Towards St. Peter's Island

Saturday Oct 25

Came with strong breezes from S W and squally steering S E E at night pleasant set all sail last part wind variable with heavy squalls and plenty of rain double reefed the topsails saw finches
That Ends 1st Observation
By Ace lat 35.50 long 31.20

Sunday Oct 26

Came with fresh gales from S S W with heavy squalls and plenty of rain steering S S E per compass at 6 P.M. Breezes are heavy back in face and more rapid close with the main midnight wind hauled and cleared off last part heavy gales with high sea
lat 35.57 long 32.50

Monday Oct 27

Begins with heavy gales from W S W with a high sea running steering S S E per compass at midnight wind hauled main to the Southward with squally squalls attended with rain steering East by S under close reef topsails last part gale abated sun wind South with a heavy sea and squally weather Ends 1st Observation
By Ace lat 34.20 long 33.50

Tuesday Oct 28

Came with heavy gales from South steering East with close reef topsails set middle weather more moderate turned and reef out of the topsails last part fresh breezes and pleasant weather
Ends lat 33.48 long 35.00
Observation 27. Route broken

Wednesday Oct 29

Begins with fresh breezes from S S W steering S E E per compass saw porpoises last part light air from South Ends lat 34.22 long 36.47
