Begins with calm weather finished boiling the whale last part left ashore at 8

Tuesday Feb 17

Came with light breeze from N.E. steering N.W. Ends the same

Lat 1-15 Long 162-50

Wednesday Feb 18

Came with light breeze from the Eastward steering N.W. by N. about the foremast repaired it. Saw a school of blackfish lower got one middle and last part fresh heaves from N.E.

Lat 5-00 Long 161-37

Thursday Feb 19

Begins with fresh heaves from N.E. steering N.N.W. with all sail set saw a school of porpoises threw the night squally last part pleasant weather

Lat 5-26 Long 160-36

Friday Feb 20

Begins with pleasant breeze from N.E. steering N.W. by N. at 6 P.M. kept off with West to chase Ashueland Islands at 8 saw hawks having N.E. by N. took in gullwindails luffed to see the wind at 3 A.M. kept off N.W. saw Head Ashueland Islands

Borne To Gorham

at 9 A.M. passed the islands saw number of natives on the beach they are low islands covered with cocoanuts trees Ends The Day

Saturday Feb 21

Begins with strong breeze from N.E. and pleasant weather steering N.W. by N. last part moderate breeze and clear weather employed repairing an old foremast saw firebacks

Lat 5-13 Long 158-40

Sunday Feb 22

All these 24 hours fresh breezes and pleasant weather

Lat 9-25 Long 156-53

Monday Feb 23

fresh breeze and squally fresh weather about mainmast gullwindails repaired it

Ends Lat 11-06 Long 152-19

Tuesday Feb 24

All these 24 hours strong breezes and squally weather midnight Landball sight the light

Lat 12-52 Long 149-20

Wednesday Feb 25

Begins with fresh breezes and squally weather steering N.W. by N. last part moderate breezes with frequent rain squalls employed clearing down the sperm oil

Lat 13-56 Long 147-08

Thursday Feb 26

Came with light breeze from N.E. and pleasant breeze steering down the oil at 4 P.M. set Kate Bare W.N. at 68 miles by steering at 10 A.M. saw the land and a Beech standing in towards it

Ends Lat 14-10 Long 145-15
