Begins with fine trade and pleasant weather
Heading N^W at 4 P.M. Guano bar S. E. Dist 20 m
Island later E. N. E. Dist 25 miles middle and last
part fresh trade and squally Lat 15.04 Long 140.40

Wednesday March 10

Begins with fresh trade and squally heading N^W
middle and last part weather about the same
put one reef in the topsails employed repairing
the spanker Lat 16.51 Long 145.00

Thursday Mar 11

Strong trade and pleasant weather
heading N^W with single reef topsails
at last part weather the same Lat 18.29 Long 148.10

Friday March 12

Fresh trade and pleasant weather heading
N^W by N with single reef topsails at
last part light breeze and pleasant Ends
Lat 19.35 Long 140.30

Saturday March 13

Begins with light trade and pleasant weather
heading N^W by N one employed in duties of the
ship last part light breeze from E. N. E.
Lat 21.04 Long 140.00

Sunday March 14

Begins with light breeze and pleasant
weather heading North Ends the same
Lat 21.38 Long 139.21

Monday March 15

Begins with light breeze from the Eastward
and pleasant weather last part wind from South
Lat 23.44 Long 140.15

Tuesday March 16

Begins with pleasant breeze from S. S. W. steering
N^W by W employed repairing the Mainmast
at Midnight wind hauled out N^W in a heavy
squall sail all hands took in sail last
part weather more moderate set Double
reef topsails at 12 did per Island bar light
Dist 5 miles were ship heading N^W
Lat 24.55 Long 140.31

Wednesday March 17

Begins with fresh breeze from N. N. E.
heading N^W with Double reef topsails
set finished the Mainmast and kept it
middle wind and weather the same last part
wind from East steering North but a new
mainmast employed fitting the old mainmast
for a fore one Lat 26.15 Long 139.51

Thursday March 18

Begins with fresh breeze from E. S. E.
steering North at 4 P.M. hauled up E. S. E.
wind S. E. saw fine looky middle fresh gales
with plenty of rain at 6 P.M. wind hauled N^W
in a heavy squall hove to under a close reef
mainmast last part clear weather and heavy
sea Lat 27.50 Long 140.10

Friday March 19

Coin with fresh gales from N^W heading N. N. E. a heavy
sea on middle light winds from N. N. E. were ship
heading N^W last part calm
Lat 28.12 Long 140.45
