Monday March 29
Begins with light breeze from ~~North~~ ^{South} and pleasant weather steering South then ~~perishes~~ at night rainy S.W. wind hauled West in a heavy squall first part fresh gales Lat 32° 48' Long 151° 30'

Tuesday March 30
Begins with strong gales from West steering N.W. & with double reef topsails set at 4 P.M. wind hauled N.W. in a heavy squall with ice fair and mizen top sail muddled and last part fresh gales from N.W. Thus Ensigns to Observe.
By Sea Lat 34° 00' Long 152° 00'

Wednesday March 31
Come with fresh gales from N.W. heading N.W. & with double reef topsails set at night blows on fresh with a heavy sea on at twelve low to under a close reef topsail last part gale abated sun Lat 34° 38' Long 154° 20'

Thursday March 1
Begins with fresh gales from N.W. at 6 P.M. wind hauled N.W. & wave ship heading N.W. set close reef topsails show the bright weather about the same last part squally weather with rain subvent the mizen topsail repaired it Ensigns Lat 35° 24' Long 155° 22'

Friday April 2
Begins with fresh breezes from N.W. & heading N.W. at night blows on fresh from N.E. heading N.W. with double reef topsails set last part pleasant breezes from East steering North show two whales going south to conclusion took them to be right whale Ensigns Lat 37° 10' Long 153° 00'
