

Ship Shelocks Lybuck Clement

1833
Thursday
October 31
These 24 hours commence with strong gale from N.W. and rough sea, took in sail and lay to under close reef. Maint. sprail and foresail, heading S.W. by S.
Midnight wore ship heading to the North & W. Latter part strong gale from N.W. and very rough sea, heading N.W. by W. Whaler in sight.

1833
Friday
Nov 1
These 24 hours commence with strong wind from the Southward and Westward, cloudy and rough sea, under double reef topsail heading to the Westward, spoke and banded ship Emerald, two other ships in sight.
Latter part moderate breeze and cloudy, made sail at day light, chased Whaler but got none.

1833
Saturday
Nov 2
These 24 hours commence with moderate wind and clouds, lowered and hilled a whale to carboard boat, took him alongside and commenced cutting, at dark lark'd down and lay by the whale. Latter part moderate wind at dawn finish'd cutting the whale at the work, aging, Emerald in sight.

1833
Sunday
Nov 3
These 24 hours commence with moderate wind from Northward and Westward, all sail set on a wind to the Westward, lowered the boat for whale, Warts boat fasten'd at run, it hilled the whale, he sunk and took one line with him, employ'd trying to Latter part strong wind from the Westward under double reef topsail, heading South, two ships in sight, employ'd sweeping oil.

1833
Monday
Nov 4
These 24 hours commence with strong gale from the West, under double reef topsail heading South, few ships in sight spoke ship Norfolk Alley, 5 Whaler, also ship Livia, of Sag Harbor 2 Whaler, at 4 P.M. finish'd trying out, at sunset lay by under close reef. Maint. sprail & foresail. Latter part strong gale from North & W. and Westward on a wind heading to Westward, two ships in sight booper'd and stow'd down the oil in fore hold.

1833
Tuesday
Nov 5
These 24 hours commence with moderate wind and very rough sea, under easy sail heading to the Southward, a little latter secured a weight whale took water alongside the ship, down boat, did not get part.
at sunset took in sail. Latter part moderate wind from the Northward made all sail to the Southward two ships in sight, employ'd sweeping boat.

1833
Wednesday
Nov 6
These 24 hours commence with moderate wind from the Northward and pleasant weather, all sail set steering S.W. by S, two ships in sight, at sunset saw four Whaler, two late to lower, took in sail and lay by heading to the Westward, Latter part strong wind from N.W. made sail at daylight, 7 P.M. spoke ship Elmer, Leonard 1 Whaler, saw Whaler, going quick to windward, down boat in chase, did not get part, two men rich, -

1833
Thursday
Nov 7
These 24 hours commence with strong wind from N.W., all sail set on a wind to Southward and Westward, at sunset saw a whale two miles off, took in sail. Latter part moderate wind from the Southward, heading different courses, two ships in sight, spoke ship Child, Luce, M. Whaler, - all sail set - two men unwell.

1833
Friday
Nov 8
These 24 hours commence with light winds from the Southward, steering N.E. saw Whaler, lowered the boat and hilled a whale, he sunk while towing to the ship, at sunset took in sail. Latter part moderate wind from the Southward at day light made sail and steer'd different courses.

1833
Saturday
Nov 9
These 24 hours commence with moderate wind from the Southward, two ships in sight, saw Einbacher, Hempbacher, Grampen's and Wright Whaler, lowered the boat and chased two hours, did not get part, at sunset took in the sail heading to the Southward, Latter part strong breeze from the Eastward, at daylight made sail. - I ordered one of the Men (David Lapsun) to draw water, he refused to do it, I ordered him to make him do it, he struck me three times and threatened to split my brain out, with a shovel he had caught up, I then put him in the rigging, at daylight Hammond come on deck, and I inform'd him what the man was in the rigging for, he immediately took his cat, and gave the man about two dozen, took David out of the rigging and put handcuffs on him, until he can behave. - Spoke ship Bourbon, 1 Whaler.

1833
Sunday
Nov 10
These 24 hours commence with cloudy weather and moderate wind from the Southward, steering to the Southward, Einbacher in sight, at 2 P.M. let David Lapsun out of stocks, on condition that he behaves with propriety. Latter part moderate wind from the Northward and Westward, all sail set, steering South, heading in sight at 3 P.M. all well on board.
