March 4th 1834
Tuesday
These 24 hours commence with fine breezes from the Southward, steering to the East. Latter part strong wind from the Southward on a wind to the Eastward, employ'd repairing old sails, nothing in sight.

March 5th 1834
Wednesday
These 24 hours commence with moderate winds from the Southward heading to the Eastward, at sunset took in sail. Latter part moderate winds and pleasant made all sail at daylight, heading on a wind to the Northward, repairing old sails.

March 6th 1834
Thursday
These 24 hours commence with moderate winds from the Eastward, heading to the Northward, at sunset took in sail. Latter part moderate winds from the Eastward, on a wind to the Northward made sail at daylight.

March 7th 1834
Friday
These 24 hours commence with moderate winds from the Eastward, on a wind to the South and East, at sunset took in sail. Latter part moderate and pleasant, at daylight made all sail, heading to the Eastward, employ'd in mending jobs.

March 8th 1834
Saturday
These 24 hours commence with light air from the Westward, at sunset took in sail. Latter part strong breezes and cloudy, made sail at daylight, heading to the Eastward.

March 9th 1834
Sunday
These 24 hours commence with fresh breezes, at sunset took in sail, heading to the Eastward. Latter part strong winds from the Southward, made sail at daylight, steering to the Eastward.

March 10th 1834
Monday
These 24 hours commence with strong breezes from the South, steering to the Eastward, at sunset took in sail. Latter part strong breezes and flying clouds, at daylight set single reef to sail, with employ'd in ship's duty.

March 11th 1834
Tuesday
These 24 hours commence with strong winds and flying clouds steering to the Eastward, under single reef to sail. Latter part strong winds from South and East, at sunset took in sail, heading North and Eastward, employ'd in mending jobs.

March 12th 1834
Wednesday
These 24 hours commence with strong gales and rough, at sunset took in sail.

Wednesday
Latter part strong breezes and strong winds at daylight set Polars reef to sail, heading to the North and East.
Lat 25° 40'

March 13th 1834
Thursday
These 24 hours commence with strong gales from Eastward, under ship to South at sunset took in sail, headed to the North at daylight made sail again. Latter part from the East headed to the North at daylight made sail in order to their bearing to wind Lat 26° 14'

March 14th 1834
Friday
These 24 hours commence with fine breezes from the East heading to the North at sunset took in sail. Latter part squally the latter part moderate winds and pleasant at daylight made sail heading on the wind to the South.

March 15th 1834
Saturday
These 24 hours commence with light winds from the S.E. East and pleasant weather, at sunset took in sail and were ship heading to the North at daylight made sail the latter part squally with rain.

March 16th 1834
Sunday
These 24 hours commence with the wind from the North heading to the Westward squally with rain at sunset took in sail at daylight made sail, the latter part fine breezes and pleasant weather. The ship has been under for some time and out see that was the 13th but the most part sensible he got altitude which was found right it is 10th when on deck when few moments after went below and as we suspect went out of the cabin, windows and has not been seen since. The truck of his hat and shoes as the boys in common to see him.

Lat 27° 58'

March 17th 1834
Monday
These 24 hours commence with strong breezes from the North steering to the Westward at sunset took in sail. The middle part squally at sunset made sail heading Eastward. Latter part light winds and calms no observation.

March 18th 1834
Tuesday
These 24 hours commence with light from the North at sunset took in sail heading to the Westward at daylight made sail steering to the Westward, latter part light winds and pleasant weather.

Lat 27° 00'

March 19th 1834
Wednesday
These 24 hours commence with light winds and pleasant weather. The wind from the North heading to the Westward, at 4 P.M. took in ship at sunset took in sail the latter part strong breezes from the South and squally steering to the North.

Lat 27° 30'
