 these 24 hours commences with light winds and calms from the South heading West by N to 4 P.M. tried the current found it setting to the S East the middle part bascule winds with rain at sundown saw a sail on the Starboard bow heading westward the latter part the wind from the S West heading heading
 Lat 36-23-5 to 36-25-5 and 94, 95, 96, 97, 98, 99, 100

April 1854
 Sunday
 these 24 hours commences with strong gales from the S West heading to S.W. at 8 P.M. both in the top-galonsails at 5 P.M. reefed the top sails at 4 P.M. closed up the fore and main top-sails at 10 P.M. still more slight heading to the West by N the wind from the South East the fore and main top-sails the middle part squally at sundown made at sea the latter part light winds and calms with heavy squalls from from the S.W. and a strong current

 these 24 hours commences with light winds and calms with a heavy swell from the S.W. the middle part baric winds and calms and cloudy weather the latter part light winds and pleasant weather wind from from the Eastward heading to S.W.

 these 24 hours commences with light winds and pleasant weather the wind from the Eastward the watch employed in mending the top sails the middle part calm the latter part the wind from the South steering on the to S.W.

Lat 38-10-5 to 38-12-5

April 1854
 Wednesday
 these 24 hours commences with strong breezes from the S.W. steering on the wind to the S.W. West at 5 P.M. took in top-galonsails and single reefed the top sails the middle squally with rain at 5 P.M. the latter part the top sails are set the main top galonsails the latter part fine breezes from the South East steering to S.W. the watch employed in mending sails

 these 24 hours commences with fine breezes from the S East steering S.W. the middle fine breezes from the South latter fine gales from the South steering S.W. West

 these 24 hours commences with fine gales from the South steering S.W. West the watch employed sending up steering sails began and sail the middle and latter part fine gales from the wind from the S East the
