Groceries.Sunday Feb^y 12th 1854.

Begins with light trades from S.E. and pleasant weather heading S. & W. under all sail, the watch employed breaking out for tea, coffee, meat and dried apples, middle and latter part Irish trades from S.E. and E. S.E. with some squalls, heading S. and S. S.W. part of the time under all sail, and part with the top gallant sails in.

So ends these 24 hours. Lat. By obs. 19° 34' S.
Long. By $\odot$ at noon 29° 52' 15" W. at 4 P.M. 29° 59' 30" W. Bar. 30.2.

Trinidad.Coopering Bread.Monday Feb^y 13th 1854.

Commences with Irish trades from E. S.E. heading to the Southward under all sail, at 2nd 30 P.M. saw the Island of Trinidad bearing S. S.E. per compass Dist. 40 miles, (Chrs. gives the ship 15 miles too far West.) at sunset the land bearing S.E. by E. per compass, middle part heading S. S.W. latter part very light breezes from S. S.E. heading S.W. under all sail. All hands employed breaking out between decks, coopering bread and sails.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 21° 50' Long. By $\odot$ 30° 47' 45" W. Bar. 30.2.

Meat.Tuesday Feb^y 14th 1854.

Begins with light breezes from S. S.E. and S.E. heading S.W. and S. S.W. under all sail, finished stowing off between decks and broke out the lower hold for meat, one sail in sight, middle part much the same, latter part light baffling breezes from S.E. to E. N.E. with light falls of rain.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 23° 09' Long. By $\odot$ 31° 26' 30" W. Bar. 30.2.

Pleasant.Wednesday Feb^y 15th 1854.

Commences with light breezes from E. S.E. and pleasant, heading to the Southward, one sail in sight, middle and latter part light breezes from E. S.E. and E. with pleasant weather, heading to the Southward under all sail, one Brig in sight.

So ends these 24 hours. Lat. By obs. 25° 12' Long. By $\odot$ 31° 24' 45" W. Bar. 30.1.

Towards the Cape of Good Hope. A.D. 1854.

Leonidas.Thursday Feb^y 16th 1854.

Begins with a calm, and very light airs from the Eastward, at 5 P.M. lowered the boats to practice, and spoke the Brig *Leonidas* of Glasgow, 46 days from Glasgow for the Isle of France, middle and latter part very light baffling airs and calms. The watch employed at sundry jobs, and painted the starboard boat.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 25° 36' Long. By $\odot$ 31° 29' 00" W. Bar. 30.2.

Grampus's.Friday Feb^y 17th 1854.

Commences with a calm, and very light baffling airs, heading to the S.E. the Brig *Leonidas* in sight, middle and latter part light baffling breezes from E. to S.W. heading to the S.E. under all sail, saw a school of grampus's, and painted the larboard boat.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 25° 57' Long. By $\odot$ 31° 20' 30" W. Bar. 30.2.

Painting.Saturday Feb^y 18th 1854.

Begins with very light breezes from E. N.E. heading to the S.E. under all sail, the Brig *Leonidas* and two other sails in sight, middle and latter part light breezes from E. N.E. and S.E. heading to the S.E. under all sail, painted the waist boat and the ship's water ways, the *Leonidas* and three other sails in sight, two of them American ships, one a whaler.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 26° 43' Long. By $\odot$ 31° 09' 15" W. Bar. 30.2.

White Water.Sunday Feb^y 19th 1854.

Commences with light breezes from N. N.E. steering S.E. under all sail, saw white water, too windward, middle and latter part light breezes from N. N.E. and N.E. steering S.E. under all sail.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 27° 51' Long. By $\odot$ at 4 P.M. 28° 29' 45" Long. By $\odot$ at 9 P.M. 28° 56' 45" By Lunar. 28° 15' 45" W. Bar. 30.2.

All sail.Monday Feb^y 20th 1854.

Begins with light breezes from N. N.E. and pleasant weather, steering S.E. under all sail, middle and latter part moderate breezes and pleasant weather, steering S.E. under all sail. The cook sick.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 29° 11' Long. By $\odot$ at 4 P.M. 26° 50' 30" Long. By $\odot$ at 9 P.M. 27° 12' 45" By Lunar. 27° 10' 45" W. Bar. 30.3.
