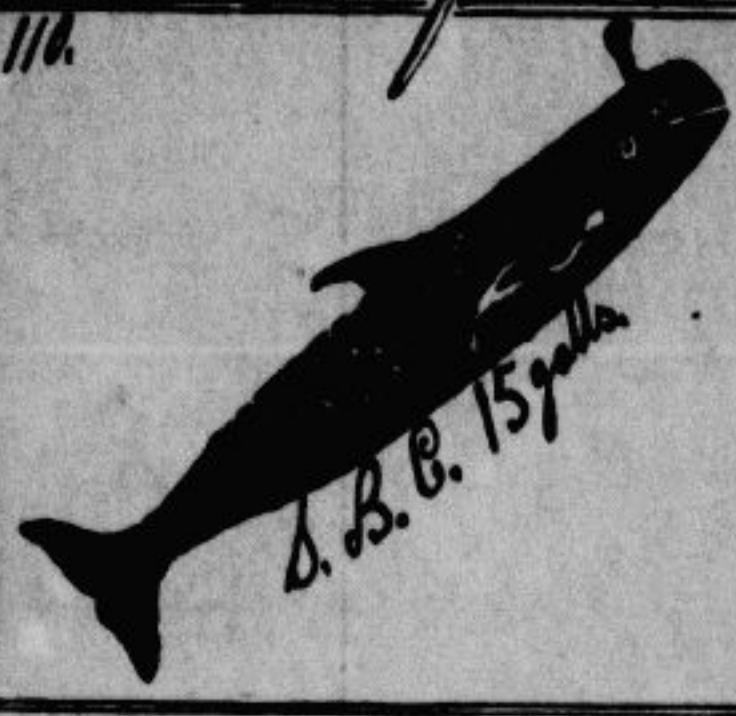
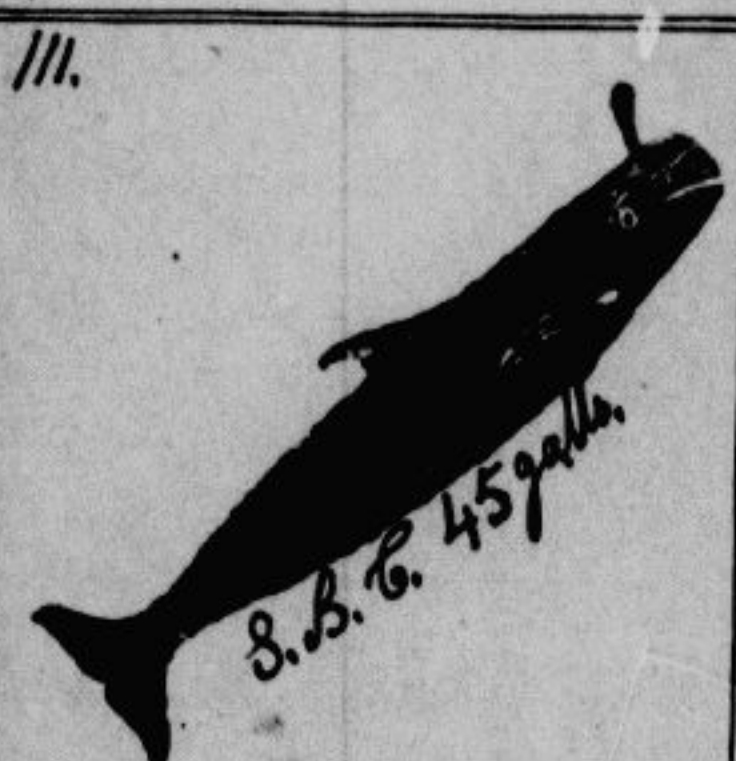


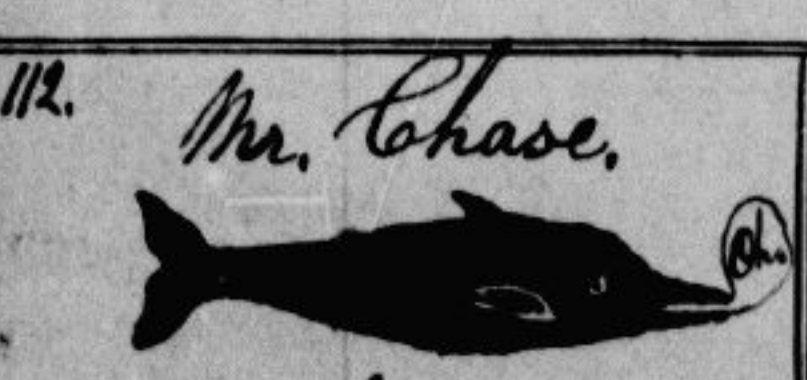
22. *Barge Smyrna of New Bedford, Mass.*



Tuesday March 28th 1854.
Begins with very light breezes from the N.E. steering S. by E. at 22 P.M. saw a school of blackfish, lowered and chased, starboard boat took one, larboard boat struck one and the iron braved, waist boat struck and the iron broke, middle part light breezes from the N.W. steering S. by E. and S. by E. latter part light breezes from the Westward steering S. by E. under all sail, lowered the boats for blackfish but saw them no more after the boats were down. Bar. 30.2.
So ends &c. Lat. By D.R. 39.40. Long. By ϕ 30.28.45.



Wednesday March 29th 1854.
Commences with light breezes from the S.W. and cloudy weather, heading S. E. and S. E. by E. under all sail, one sail in sight, middle part moderate breezes from S.W. heading the same with the main top gallant sail out, latter part light breezes from S. heading E. S. E. under all sail, at 8 o'clock, saw a school of blackfish lowered and took one to the starboard boat, larboard boat struck one and braved. Bar. 30.4.
So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 39.00. Long. By ϕ 33.16.15. E.

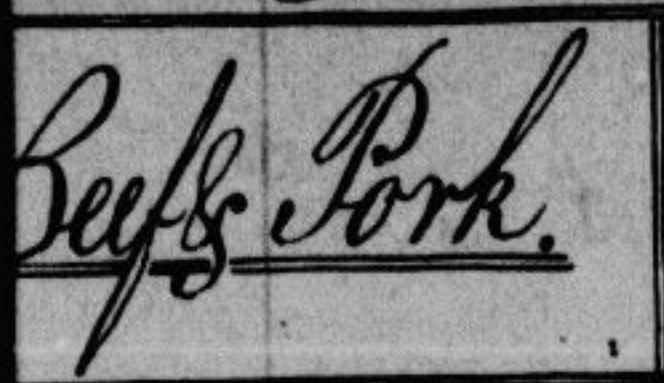


Thursday March 30th 1854.
Begins with pleasant breezes from S. heading E. S. E. under all sail, and caught a porpoise, middle part wind from S. S. W. and cloudy heading S. E. and S. E. by E. under all sail, latter part light breezes from S. S. E. and unsteady heading to the Eastward under all sail, and boiled out two blackfish. Bar. 30.4.
So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 38.33. Long. By ϕ 35.39.45.

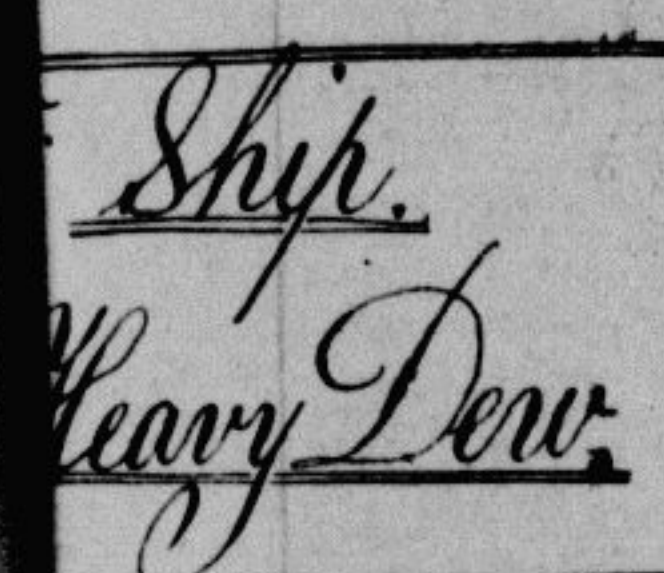


Friday March 31st 1854.
Commences with brisk breezes from S. S. E. heading S. W. with the gaff top sail and fore top gallant sail in, saw blackfish and cowfish, struck a cowfish and braved, middle part wind from the S. E. latter part brisk breezes from E. S. E. and E. heading S. and S. S. E. with the main top gallant sail and flying jib out, saw blackfish and cowfish. So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 39.59. Long. By ϕ 36.40.15. Bar. 30.4.

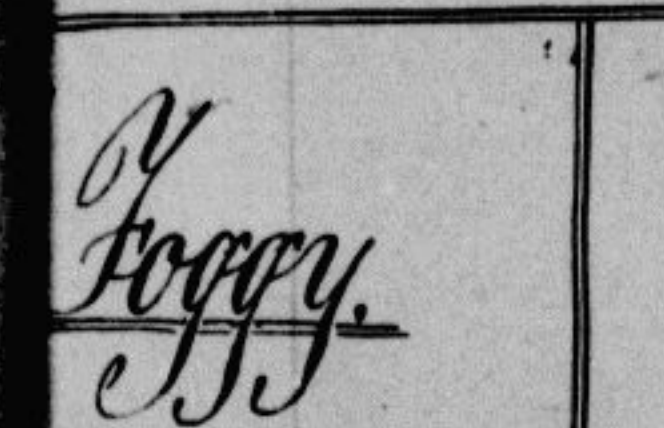
29. *Towards New Holland. A.D. 1854.*



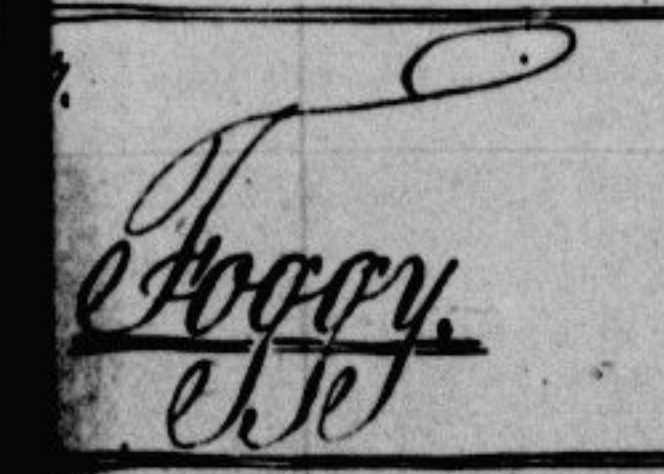
Saturday April 1st 1854.
Begins with fresh breezes from E. N. E. steering S. E. by S. with the main top gallant sail and flying jib out, saw spouts and breaches supposed to be a humpback or finback, middle and latter part pleasant breezes from E. N. E. and N. E. steering S. E. by S. broke out for beef, pork, flour and water. Bar. 30.2.
So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 41.11. Long. By ϕ 39.03.30.



Sunday April 2nd 1854.
Commences with pleasant breezes from E. N. East steering S. E. by S. under all sail, one ship in sight, middle part moderate with a very heavy dew through the night, latter part light breezes from E. N. E. and pleasant steering S. E. by S. under all sail. Bar. 30.2.
So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 42.01. Long. By ϕ 41.04.15.



Monday April 3rd 1854.
Begins with light breezes from E. N. E. and some foggy, steering S. E. by S. under all sail, middle part light breezes from the N. E. and foggy steering S. E. latter part brisk breezes from N. steering S. E. with the fore topmast studding sail set, and saw finback. Bar. 30.2.
So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 42.35. Long. By D.R. 43.35.00.



Tuesday April 4th 1854.
Commences with brisk breezes from N. and a heavy fog, steering S. E. with the topmast studding sail out, and saw a finback, middle part light breezes from N. W. to N. E. with a thick fog, latter part light breezes from S. E. and E. S. E. heading E. N. E. and N. E. under the topsails and courses. Bar. 30.1.4.
So ends &c. Lat. By D.R. 42.10. Long. By D.R. 45.00.00.



Wednesday April 5th 1854.
Begins with light breezes from E. S. E. to E. N. E. at 2 P.M. wore round and headed to the S. E. with the fore top gallant sail in, middle and latter part brisk breezes from N. East and N. E. steering S. E. with the main top gallant sail and flying jib out, saw a finback. Bar. 30.1.
So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 42.51. Long. By ϕ 49.56.00.
