


50. Eugrab Anonyms for Mon. Dredget, Isam.

212. Cooled down. Saturday July 8<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with brisk breezes from E. S. E. heading S. by W. under double reefed topsails and employed boiling, middle part heading to the N. E. at midnight cooled down, latter part brisk breezes from E. S. E. heading to the N. E. under all sail, and saw finbacks. So ends. Lat. By obs. 22. 22. Long. By  $\odot$  105. 26. 15. Bar. 30. 2. +

213. Mr. Chase.  10<sup>th</sup> Sunday July 9<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commenced with brisk breezes from S. E. and pleasant overhead, standing S. S. W. under whole topsails and courses, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes from S. E. at 9<sup>h</sup> A. M. saw a large lone sperm whale working quite fast to the S. E. lowered three boats without success, at noon the boats away from the ship. So ends. Lat. By obs. 22. 39. Long. By  $\odot$  105. 23. 15. Bar. 30. 2. +

214. Now down. Monday July 10<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with pleasant breezes from S. S. E. took up the boats and made all sail to work too windward the whale having gone that way, middle part laying to the N. E. under easy sail, latter part wind from E. S. E. heading to the Southward under double reefed topsails, and employed stowing down oil. So ends. Lat. By obs. 22. 49. Long. By  $\odot$  105. 14. 15. Bar. 30. 2.

215. Humpbacks. Tuesday July 11<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commenced with wind from E. S. E. heading to the Southward and saw humpbacks, middle and latter part light winds and pleasant weather standing on the Southern tack, and saw humpbacks again. So ends. Lat. By obs. 23. 22. Long. By  $\odot$  105. 10. 15. Bar. 30. 2. (Not no dinner to top)

216. Coffee. Wednesday July 12<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with very light breezes from E. S. E. heading S. by W. under all sail except the fore top gallant sail, middle part heading to the Northward under double reefed topsails and foresail, latter part very light breezes from E. S. E. to E. N. E. heading from S. to S. E. under all sail, took out the remainder of one cask of coffee, one sail in sight, and saw porpoises. Bar. 30. 2. + So ends. Lat. By obs. 23. 40. Long. By  $\odot$  105. 17. 00. Gypsy 10<sup>h</sup> 5<sup>h</sup> 00.

217. Gypsy. Thursday July 13<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commences with very light breezes from N. N. E. heading to the Eastward under all sail, one sail in sight, (this afternoon while looking at the log book I perceived that the 1<sup>st</sup> Mate, Mr. Chase, had mentioned there that he thought my actions were rather singular, and that my reason was affected, at the same time, I have noticed things that he and others may have thought passed by without being observed by me, such as stopping on deck, and watching me, peeping down the ship's light when I was below, and other trivial things that I will not mention here) at about 6 P. M. spoke the Barque Gypsy of New Bedford, 31 mos. out, 1450 tms. sp. middle part heading to the Eastward under easy sail, latter part pleasant breezes from the Northward heading E. S. E. with the main top gallant sail out, saw a finback, the Gypsy in sight. So ends. Lat. By obs. 23. 35. Long. By  $\odot$  105. 46. 30. Bar. 30. 1.

218. Rain. Friday July 14<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with light breezes from N. N. W. and pleasant heading N. E. by E. the Gypsy in sight, and saw a finback, middle part wind from the Westward and some rainy, latter part wind from the S. W. steering N. E. and N. E. by E. under whole topsails and foresail, saw a humpback and finbacks, the Gypsy in sight. So ends. Lat. By obs. 22. 54. Long. By D. R. 106. 30. 00. Bar. 30. 1. +

219. Heavy swell. Saturday July 15<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commences with brisk breezes from S. S. E. to S. E. and cloudy heading from E. to E. N. E. under whole topsails and courses, middle part moderate, latter part brisk breezes from S. E. heading S. W. by S. with a very heavy swell from the S. W. saw a sulphur bottom. So ends. Lat. By obs. 22. 53. Long. By  $\odot$  106. 31. 00. Bar. 30. 2.

220. Cuttle-fish Bone. Sunday July 16<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with brisk breezes from S. S. E. heading S. W. under whole topsails and courses, saw two humpbacks and a cuttle-fish bone, middle part heading to the S. W. under easy sail, latter part wind from the Southward heading E. S. E. under whole topsails and courses. So ends these 24 hours. Lat. By obs. 23. 17. Long. By  $\odot$  at 10<sup>h</sup> M. 106. 08. 00. At 3 P. M. 106. 30. 30. Bar. 30. 2.
