

56. Barque Smyrna of New Bedford, Mass.

241. Rain. Sunday Aug. 6<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commences with moderate breezes, employed chocking off the hatches, and finished painting outside, middle part high breezes, latter part quite moderate with calms and some rain. So ends &c.

242. Took the Anchor. Monday Aug. 7<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with moderate breezes from S. E. most of the crew ashore rambling about, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes from the Eastward at 6 A. M. took the anchor and started for Anjier, at noon up with third point. So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 6. 23'.

243. Anjier. Tuesday Aug. 8<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commences with fresh breezes from the Northward working up the Straits of Sunda, at 6 P. M. came too anchor between third and fourth point, in 13 fathoms of water (muddy bottom) and paid out 50 fathoms of chain, fourth point bearing N. N. E. per compass, Dist. 10 or 12 miles, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes from the E. S. E. at 6 A. M. took the anchor and stood up the Straits, at about noon came too anchor abreast of Anjier in 10 fathoms of water and paid out 50 fathoms of chain, and here we find the Mars again. So ends &c.

244. Liberty. Wednesday Aug. 9<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with light breezes and pleasant weather, middle and latter part light breezes and pleasant weather, the larboard watch on liberty, the other watch painted the white streak on the starboard side, and the spare spars. So ends &c.

245. Liberty. Thursday Aug. 10<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commences with pleasant weather at night the watch came aboard, middle and latter part moderate, the starboard watch on liberty, the other watch painted the larboard side. So ends &c. Long. By  $\approx 105. 23. 45''$ .

246. Deserters. Friday Aug. 11<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with light breezes and pleasant weather, middle part moderate, seven of the crew deserted in one of the boats, latter part pleasant weather, the larboard watch on liberty. So ends &c.

57. At Anjier, A. D. 1854.

247. Liberty. Saturday Aug. 12<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commences with pleasant weather at night the watch came aboard, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes, employed taking off yards, (Joa. C. Keil, boatsteward, refused duty) the starboard watch on liberty. So ends these 24 hours.

248. Liberty. Sunday Aug. 13<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with high breezes from the Northward, took off the remainder of the yards, at night the watch came aboard, middle and latter part moderate, the bark Mars sailed, the ship Panama of New York arrived 42 days from Liverpool bound to Shanghai; our larboard watch ashore on liberty. So ends &c.

249. Liberty. Monday Aug. 14<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commences with light breezes and cloudy, middle part rainy with thunder and lightning, latter part pleasant taking aboard recruits and stowing them away, the starboard watch on liberty. So ends &c.

250. Moderate. Tuesday Aug. 15<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with high breezes and cloudy at night the watch came aboard, middle and latter part moderate, no watch on liberty, employed making preparations for sea. So ends &c.

251. Moderate. Wednesday Aug. 16<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Commences with light breezes and some cloudy, middle part moderate, the ship Ariel of N. York lying here 101 days from N. Y. for Shanghai, latter part calm. So ends &c. Long. By  $\approx 105. 20. 30''$ , Lat.  $105. 54. 55''$ .

252. Took the Anchor. Thursday Aug. 17<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Begins with fresh breezes from the Westward, ready for sea, lying here with a head wind, middle part very light airs and calms, latter part light baffling breezes with showers of rain at 10. 45. A. M. took the anchor and commenced working out from Anjier. So ends &c. Long. By  $\approx 105. 44. 30''$ .
