324. **Heavy Swell.** Saturday Oct. 28th 1854.
Commences with strong breezes from S. W. and ruggid, heading N. N. W. under double reefed topsails and foresail, middle part under short sail, latter part fresh breezes from S. W. with a very heavy swell heading from N. N. W. to W. under double reefed topsails and courses. So ends these 24 hours. Lat. By obs. 24° 03'.

325. **Moderate.** Sunday Oct. 29th 1854.
Begins with fresh breezes from S. S. W. heading to the Westward under double reefed topsails and courses, middle part under easy sail, latter part moderate breezes from S. E. steering S. W. by W. and S. W. under whole topsails and courses. So ends. Lat. By obs. 24° 10'. Long. By obs. 48° 56' 15". By Lunar. 49° 04' 30". Bar. 30.3+.

326. **Mr. Caull.** Monday Oct. 30th 1854.
Commences with moderate breezes from S. E. heading S. S. W. under all sail except the fore and main top gallant sails, middle part heading to the Southward under short sail, latter part fresh breezes from the Eastward at 7 A. M. saw a sperm whale going fast to the Westward, at 9 A. M. lowered the boats but saw the whale no more after 10 A. M. the wind increasing, and being very ruggid, at noon the boats came alongside. So ends. Lat. By obs. 24° 48'. Long. By obs. 48° 21' 00". Bar. 30.3.

327. **Ship.** Tuesday Oct. 31st 1854.
Begins with fresh breezes from E. N. E. steering on a sweep from N. W. round to S. S. W. under double reefed topsails and foresail, looking for a whale, middle part laying to the S. E. under short sail, latter part strong breezes from N. E. heading N. N. West under double reefed topsails and courses, saw a ship steering to the Westward. So ends. Lat. By obs. 24° 57'. Long. By obs. 48° 04' 45". Bar. 30.2.

328. **Whale Ship.** Wednesday Nov. 1st 1854.
Commences with strong breezes from N. E. and clear weather overhead, but very ruggid under foot, ship under double reefed topsails and courses heading N. N. West, at 6 P. M. saw a whale ship, that we called the *Wm. & Eliza*, middle part laying to the Eastward under short sail, latter part strong breezes from N. N. E. heading N. W. under double reefed topsails and courses. So ends. Lat. By obs. 25° 03'. Long. By obs. 47° 54' 45". Bar. 30.1+.

329. **Yams.** Thursday Nov. 2nd 1854.
Begins with fresh breezes from N. N. E. heading to the N. W. under double reefed topsails and courses, and overhauled the yams, middle part wind from N. N. W. and rainy, latter part wind from S. S. W. steering E. under all sail till 9 P. M. then took in the top gallant sails, saw a finback bound too windward. So ends. Lat. By D. R. 24° 55'. Long. By D. R. 48° 50' 00". Bar. 30.2.

330. **Try Works.** Friday Nov. 3rd 1854.
Commences with fresh breezes from the Southward and directly steering E. under a whole main topsail, double reefed fore topsail and courses, middle and latter part quite moderate and cloudy heading to the Eastward, employed copping the try works. So ends. Lat. By D. R. 24° 35'. Long. By D. R. 50° 00' 00". Bar. 30.2.

331. **Cloudy.** Saturday Nov. 4th 1854.
Begins with moderate breezes from S. E. steering N. E. with the main top gallant sail out, the weather cloudy, middle part heading to the S. W. under short sail, latter part light breezes from S. E. and pleasant weather heading to the S. W. with the main top gallant sail out, at about 10 A. M. saw sperm whales breaching, and working into the N. E. at about 11 A. M. lowered
