427. Saturday Feb^{ry} 10th 1855. Commences with light breezes from N. E. by N. and pleasant, steering S. E. by S. under all sail, and rose new main topsail halliards, (23 fms. 2 1/2 in.) middle part moderates with a great deal of lightning from N. W. to S. W. latter part very light breezes from N. E. to N. N. W. with very light rain steering S. E. by S. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 38. 30. Long. By obs. 40. 13. 15. X 43. 49. 15. Bar. 30. 0.

430. Sunday Feb^{ry} 11th 1855. Begins with very light airs from the N. E. and cloudy steering S. E. by S. under all sail, middle and latter part very light airs from N. E. to N. W. and cloudy weather, steering the same course. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 38. 56. Long. By obs. 41. 41. 00. X 45. 17. 00. Bar. 30. 1. +

431. Monday Feb^{ry} 12th 1855. Commences with very light airs from N. W. to N. S. West, steering S. E. by S. with the top gallant sails out, middle part wind from S. latter part moderate breezes from S. E. and cloudy heading E. N. E. under all sail except the fore top gallant sail and gaff topsail. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 39. 59. Long. By obs. 43. 28. 00. X 47. 04. 00. Bar. 30. 3.

432. Tuesday Feb^{ry} 13th 1855. Begins with brisk breezes from E. S. E. heading S. by W. with the fore top gallant sail and gaff topsail in, repaired the fore topmast staysail and bent it again, middle part moderate, latter part fresh breezes from E. N. E. heading S. E. saw a Dutch man of war sch. standing the same. Broke out for water. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 39. 26. Long. By obs. 45. 36. 00. X 49. 12. 00. Bar. 30. 2.

433. Wednesday Feb^{ry} 14th 1855. Commences with fresh breezes from E. N. E. and N. East steering S. E. with the main top gallant sail out, middle part strong breezes with some rain, steering the same course, latter part more moderate and some foggy steering S. E. by E. with the main top gallant sail out. Do ends &c. Lat. By D. R. 40. 10. Long. By D. R. 48. 51. 00. X 52. 27. 00. Bar. 29. 9.

434. Thursday Feb^{ry} 15th 1855. Rainy. Begins with light breezes from N. N. E. and foggy steering S. E. by E. bent the fore top gallant sail and set it, middle part strong breezes from S. and rainy heading E. S. E. under double reefed topsails and courses, latter part strong breezes and pleasant overhead carrying the same sail, saw a Barque too leeward heading to the Eastward. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 40. 22. Long. By obs. 52. 07. 45. X 55. 43. 45. Bar. 30. 1.

435. Friday Feb^{ry} 16th 1855. All sail. Commences with fresh breezes from S. heading E. by S. under a whole main topsail, double reefed fore topsail and courses, middle part very moderate, latter part light breezes from N. E. steering S. E. by E. under all sail. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 40. 16. Long. By obs. 55. 24. 15. X 57. 00. 15. Bar. 30. 1.

436. Saturday Feb^{ry} 17th 1855. Spreaders. Sea. Begins with brisk breezes from N. N. E. to N. N. W. steering S. E. by E. with the top gallant sails out, put up a pair of spreaders for the fore top gallant backstays, middle part wind from the N. W. latter part strong breezes from N. and rugged steering S. E. by E. with the top gallant sails out. Started tea. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 40. 30. Long. By obs. 57. 24. 15. X 61. 00. 15. Bar. 29. 9.

437. Sunday Feb^{ry} 18th 1855. Finback. Commences with strong breezes from W. steering S. E. by E. with the fore top gallant sail in, and saw a finback, middle and latter part more moderate steering the same course, with a very heavy swell running. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 40. 34. Long. By obs. 60. 34. 45. X 64. 10. 45. Bar. 30. 3.

438. Monday Feb^{ry} 19th 1855. Begins with moderate breezes from W. S. W. steering S. E. by E. with the light sail set, and a very heavy swell running which makes it bad for sails, middle part moderate, latter part very light airs from W. N. West, repaired the mainsail and saw blackfish lowered and struck four, killed three and saved two. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 40. 36. Long. By obs. 62. 35. 15. Lunar. 63. 00. 00. Bar. 30. 4.
