Commences with strong breezes from S. E. heading S. W. by S. under double reefed topsails and courses, saw a whale ship veer and stand to the Eastward, middle part laying to the Eastward under easy sail, latter part strong breezes from S. S. E. heading S. W. under double reefed topsails and foresail. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 26° 45'. Long. By $\odot$ 107° 39' 15". Bar. 30, 2+.

Begins with strong winds from E. S. E. heading to the Southward under a double reefed main topsail and foresail, and saw two sun-fish, middle part heading to the S. E. latter part strong breezes from E. heading S. W. E. under double reefed topsails and courses and saw two sails. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 26° 23'. Long. By $\odot$ 107° 03' 00". Bar. 30, 2+.

Commences with brisk breezes from E. S. E. heading to the S. E. under all sail except the fore top gallant sail, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes from S. E. heading S. S. E. under the topsails and courses. Rather dull times. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 27° 51'. Long. By $\odot$ 107° 54' 00". Bar. 30, 3+.

Monday April 30th 1855.

Begins with very light breezes from the S. E. and pleasant weather, heading E. S. E. under all sail, middle part carrying double reefed topsails, latter part brisk breezes from S. E. heading E. S. E. under whole topsails and courses, tarred the rigging to the spanker gaff, saw a finback and one sail. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 28° 11'. Long. By $\odot$ 108° 54' 30". Bar. 30, 3.
