W. to W. under the topsails and foresail, tarred the larboard main rigging, and fitted a new main top gallant runner (24 in. 6 fath.) and rove new main topsail reef tackles (24 in. 16 fath. each) and put the old ones forward, one sail in sight, the Cooper repairing an oil cask.
