Begins with fresh breezes from N. N. W. and some drizzly, heading N. E. by E. under double reefed topsails and foresails, middle part wind from the N. N. W. and rainy heading to the N. E. under a close reefed main topsail and foresail, latter part brisk breezes from N. heading N. N. W. under whole topsails and courses, one ship in sight.

Commences with strong breezes from N. and some squally, heading N. N. W. under double reefed topsails and courses, saw humpbacks and one ship in sight under our lee, middle part more moderate, latter part light breezes from the N. N. W. heading N. N. W. by N. under all sail, saw two ships and one bark.

Blackfish.Tuesday June 19th 1855.

Begins with light breezes from N. N. W. and pleasant, heading to the southward under all sail, three sails in sight, at sunset saw a school of blackfish and chased without success, middle part moderate about daylight saw blackfish, latter part light breezes from N. N. W. and some squally heading to the S. W. under the topsails and courses, one sail in sight.

Chasing the Run.Wednesday June 20th 1855.

Commences with light breezes from N. heading S. by N. with the main top gallant sail out, one sail in sight, middle part laying under easy sail, latter part light breezes from S. E. steering N. by N. broke out the run and re-steved it, saw a humpback.

Jumpers.Thursday June 21st 1855.

Begins with light breezes from S. E. and pleasant steering N. saw the Eliza Dunbar and a finback, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes from the Eastward steering N. N. W. employed breaking out between Decho, and saw jumpers.

Commences with light breezes from the N. E. heading N. N. W. with the main top gallant sail out, and broke out for bread, middle part light airs and calms, latter part moderate breezes from the Northward heading to the Westward and saw humpbacks, bent a new jib.

Fresh Gale.Saturday June 23rd 1855.

Begins with fresh breezes from the Westward heading to the Northward with the main top gallant sail out, with light showers of rain, middle part fresh gales from the S. S. W. heading to the S. E. under a double reefed main topsail and fore topmast staysail, latter part fresh gales from S. S. E. and rugged steering N. by E. under double reefed topsails and foresail.

Sea Natches.Sunday June 24th 1855.

Commences with fresh gales from S. E. steering N. by E. under double reefed topsails and foresail, middle part carrying the same sail, latter part strong breezes from S. E. steering N. by E. under a whole main topsail, double reefed fore topsail and foresail.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 19.12. Long. By obs. 106.24.00. Bar. 30.2+.

Molasses.Monday June 25th 1855.

Begins with strong breezes from S. E. and rugged steering N. by E. under a whole main topsail, double reefed fore topsail and foresail, middle part the same, saw porpoises, latter part strong breezes from S. E. steering N. by E. under whole topsails and courses, broke out for molasses, dried apples and vinegar.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 16.24. Long. By obs. 106.49.15. Bar. 30.2.

Flour.Tuesday June 26th 1855.

Commences with fresh breezes from S. E. and rugged steering N. by E. under whole topsails and courses, middle part steering N. by N. with the main top gallant sail out, latter part fresh breezes from the S. E. steering N. by N. under all sail, employed breaking out for flour and water.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 15.40. Long. By obs. 105.34.30. Bar. 30.1+.
