

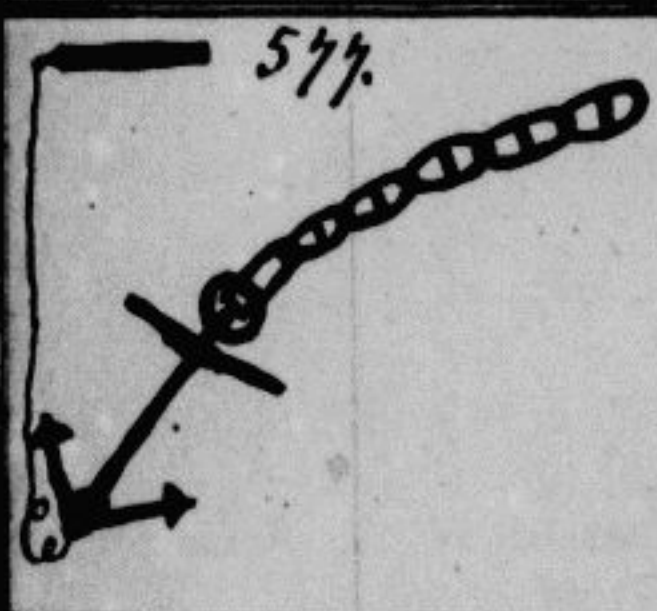

the crew.Saturday July 7th 1855.

Begins with brisk breezes and pleasant weather, finished stowing away wood, water, and sent down the tackle, middle part quite moderate, latter part brisk breezes from S.E. at about 4 P.M. took the anchor with the intention of proceeding to sea, after getting one anchor on the bow (8 A.M.) most of the crew from the forecabin, with the boatsteerers and cooper came aft (Robt. C. Dugg excepted) and wished to know if I was going to sea with so small a quantity of refreshments and without giving them any liberty, I then told them my intention was to go and finish out the cruise, then go in for recruits and to give liberty upon telling them so they went forward refusing to do duty unless they could have liberty before going to sea, and did so repeatedly, upon which the Chief Officer said he was not going to sea with the crew off duty, (trouble again) heaved up the yards and headed up the Straits of Sunda for Amjer.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 6. 24.

Sunday July 8th 1855.

Commences with light breezes from S. S. W. standing up the Straits, at about 7 P.M. came to anchor abreast of Amjer in 10 fathoms of water and paid out 30 fathoms of chain, the Pioneer lying here, middle and latter part light breezes and pleasant weather. So ends &c.

LibertyMonday July 9th 1855.

Begins with light breezes and pleasant weather, middle and latter part moderate, the larboard boat's crew ashore on liberty. So ends &c.

LibertyTuesday July 10th 1855.

Commences with very moderate breezes at night the liberty men came off with the exception of Antonio Pichaco, middle and latter part moderate, Pichaco came on board, the starboard boat's crew on liberty, board.

LibertyWednesday July 11th 1855.

Begins with moderate breezes at night the liberty men came off, with the exception of the Cooper, Steward and Mr. Snyder, middle and latter part moderate, Snyder and the Steward came off, the waist boat's crew went ashore on liberty. So ends &c.

LibertyThursday July 12th 1855.

Commences with very moderate breezes at night the liberty men came aboard with the exception of George Booms, the Cooper also came off (P.M.) middle and latter part pleasant, George Booms came aboard, the larboard boat's crew on liberty. So ends &c.

582.

LibertyFriday July 13th 1855.

Begins with very moderate breezes and warm weather, at night the liberty men came aboard, middle part moderate, latter part pleasant breezes from the N.E. Eastward, the starboard boat's crew on liberty. So ends &c. Long. By obs. 105. 26. 45.

583.

LibertySaturday July 14th 1855.

Commences with moderate breezes and pleasant, at night the liberty men came aboard, middle and latter part light breezes, the waist boat's crew on liberty. So ends &c.

584.

LibertySunday July 15th 1855.

Begins with light breezes at night the liberty men came aboard, middle and latter part light breezes and pleasant weather, the larboard boat's crew on liberty. So ends &c. Long. By obs. 105. 29. 15.

585.

LibertyMonday July 16th 1855.

Commences with moderate breezes at night the liberty men came aboard, middle and latter part moderate, the starboard boat's crew on liberty, the Stephanie and President of New Bedford arrived. So ends &c.

586.

LibertyTuesday July 17th 1855.

Begins with moderate breezes at night the liberty men came aboard with the exception of John Mc. Conguodale, middle and latter part moderate, J. Mc. C. came off, the waist boat's crew on liberty. So ends these 24 hours. Long. By obs. 105. 24. 15.

587.

WaterWednesday July 18th 1855.

Commences with moderate breezes employed taking aboard recruits, at night the liberty men came aboard, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes took aboard 400 galls. of water. So ends &c.
