Breakers.Tuesday Aug. 14th 1855.

Begins with very moderate breezes from the Eastward heading N. N. E. with the main top gallant sail out, at 4 P. M. tacked to the Southward, middle part carrying double reefed topsails and courses, latter part standing in towards Bourbon with the main top gallant sail out, the breakers in sight along the shore.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 21° 11'. Long. Byob. 55° 53' 15". Bar. 30, 3.

Two Whalers.Wednesday Aug. 15th 1855.

Commences with pleasant breezes from E. running along the S. side of Bourbon, the Helen Augusta in sight, at 2 P. M. hauled on the wind to the Southward, middle part heading off shore under reefed topsails and courses, the weather squally with rain, latter part brisk breezes from the Eastward standing in towards the land, saw two whalers standing to the Southward.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 21° 39'. Long. Byob. 55° 40' 45". Bar. 30, 4.

Left Bourbon Stern.Thursday Aug. 16th 1855.

Begins with fresh breezes from E. standing in for the South part of Bourbon, under double reefed topsails, at 4 P. M. steered of N. by S. the S. W. point of the Island bearing E. by N. per compass, middle part fresh breezes from E. steering N. by S. under double reefed topsails and foresail, latter part more moderate steering the same course with the main top gallant sail out.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 22° 14'. Long. Byob. 53° 08' 45". Bar. 30, 3.7.

Cotton foresail.Friday Aug. 17th 1855.

Commences with moderate breezes from E. steering N. by S. with the main top gallant sail out, bent the cotton foresail, middle part running under easy sail, latter part light breezes from E. and sailing steering N. by S. with the main top gallant sail out.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 23° 04'. Long. Byob. 51° 08' 45". Bar. 30.3.7.

Shy BaySaturday Aug. 18th 1855.

Begins with light breezes from E. steering N. by S. with the main top gallant sail out, at 4 P. M. saw a sperm whale working to the N. E. lowered in chase without success, middle part raining, latter part light breezes from N. E. and pleasant, employed coopers pipes of bread from between decks.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 24° 56'. Long. Byob. 50° 25' 45". Bar. 30, 3.7.

Cruising off Port Dauphin A. D. 1855.

Coopers Bread.Sunday Aug. 19th 1855.

Commences with light breezes from the N. E. and pleasant finished coopers pipes of bread from between decks, and saw a school of porpoises, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes from E. N. E. steering N. under all the square sails, and saw a finback.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 23° 01'. Long. Byob. 50° 28' 15". Lunar. 49° 51' 45". Bar. 30, 3.7.

Dolphin.Monday Aug. 20th 1855.

Begins with light breezes from E. N. E. and pleasant steering N. and saw porpoises, middle part laying under short sail, latter part light breezes from E. S. E. and pleasant steering S. W. by W. under the topsails and courses, and saw a dolphin.

(Sun. West.)
So ends. Lat. Byob. 23° 24'. Long. Byob. 50° 10' 00". Lunar. 49° 29' 00". Bar. 30, 4.

N. Finbacks.Tuesday Aug. 21st 1855.

Commences with light breezes from E. S. E. and pleasant, steering S. W. by W. saw porpoises, a finback and an albacore, middle part moderate, latter part brisk breezes from the Eastward steering to the Westward under double reefed foretopsail, whole main topsail and foresail, and saw several finbacks.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 23° 56'. Long. Byob. 50° 11' 30". Bar. 30, 4.7.

Humpback.Wednesday Aug. 22nd 1855.

Begins with brisk breezes from E. N. E. and pleasant steering N. S. W. and saw a humpback, middle part laying to the Northward under easy sail, latter part brisk breezes from the N. E. steering N. W. under double reefed topsails and courses, employed fitting rigging for a main spencer gaff.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 23° 26'. Long. Byob. 49° 21' 30". Lunar. 49° 13' 00". Bar. 30, 3.7.

Main Spencer Gaff.Thursday Aug. 23rd 1855.

Commences with brisk breezes from N. E. steering N. and W. S. W. sent up a new main spencer gaff, and saw white water, middle part fresh breezes, latter part moderate breezes from N. E. to N. heading N. W. and W. N. W. broke out for water and saw a finback.

So ends. Lat. Byob. 23° 40'. Long. Byob. 48° 42' 15". Bar. 30, 3.
