

162.	<i>Bark Imperna of New Bedford Mass.</i>
759. <u>Liberty.</u>	<i>Sunday Jan⁶ 1856.</i> Commences with moderate breezes took aboard one boat load of wood, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes the starboard watch on liberty. Do ends these 24 hours.
760. <u>Wood.</u>	<i>Monday Jan⁷ 1856.</i> Begins with light breezes at night the watch came on board, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes and pleasant, took off a boat load of wood. Do ends these 24 hours.
761. <u>Wood.</u>	<i>Tuesday Jan⁸ 1856.</i> Commences with moderate breezes took aboard two boat loads of wood, at sunset the Sonia returned having experienced a blow and lost two boats, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes and pleasant sent a raft of cashes ashore for water. Do ends.
762. <u>Water.</u>	<i>Wednesday Jan⁹ 1856.</i> Begins with brisk breezes the boats started with a raft of water but anchored it on account of a head tide, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes and pleasant took aboard the raft of water that was anchored. Do ends.
763. <u>Stowing off.</u>	<i>Thursday Jan¹⁰ 1856.</i> Commences with strong sea breezes, finished stowing away wood and water, Long. By obs. 43. 30. 00. middle part brisk breezes, latter part moderate employed making preparations for going to sea. Do ends these 24 hours. Sent new mainsail and fore top g. sails.
764. <u>Ready for Sea.</u>	<i>Friday Jan¹¹ 1856.</i> Begins with strong breezes from the S. W. the Bark about ready for sea, Long. By obs. 43. 30. 30. middle part moderate, latter part light breezes and pleasant weather. Do ends.
765. <u>Took the Anchor.</u>	<i>Saturday Jan¹² 1856.</i> Commences with fresh sea breezes and a strong current getting to the starboard, middle part moderate, latter part light land breezes at 5 1/2 A. M. took the anchor and stood out through the reef. Do ends.

766. <u>Pleasant.</u>	<i>Sunday Jan¹³ 1856.</i> Begins with pleasant breezes from N. S. W. to S. S. W. working off shore in company with the Massasoit and Sonia, at 6 1/2 A. M. tacked off shore, Westminster Hall bearing E. S. E. per compass, middle part pleasant breezes from S. S. E. heading to the S. W. latter part light breezes from S. E. to N. West steering S. S. W. under all sail, one sail in sight. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 23. 57. Long. By obs. 43. 23. 30.
767. <u>Killers.</u>	<i>Monday Jan¹⁴ 1856.</i> Commences with very light breezes from the Westward and pleasant heading S. under all sail, middle part baffling air and calms, latter part light breezes from S. S. W. heading S. E. under all sail, saw killers, the Massasoit in sight. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 24. 41. Long. By obs. 43. 41. 30.
768. <u>Fresh Breeze.</u>	<i>Tuesday Jan¹⁵ 1856.</i> Begins with brisk breezes from S. to S. S. E. heading from N. S. W. to S. W. under all sail, in company with the Massasoit, middle part fresh breezes heading S. S. W. and S. W. by S. with the light sails in, latter part brisk breezes from S. E. heading S. W. by S. with the main top gallant sail out, the Massasoit in sight astern. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 25. 23. Long. By obs. 43. 01. 00.
769. <u>French Ship.</u>	<i>Wednesday Jan¹⁶ 1856.</i> Commences with brisk breezes from S. S. E. heading S. W. under all sail except the fore top gallant sail and gaff topsail, middle part fresh breezes from S. E. heading S. S. W. under all sail, latter part more moderate heading from S. W. to S. S. W. under all sail, exchanged colors with a French Ship standing to the Westward. The watch was employed at Ship's duty. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 28. 25. Long. By obs. 42. 27. 00.
770. <u>Altering New Mainsail.</u>	<i>Thursday Jan¹⁷ 1856.</i> Begins with brisk breezes from S. E. heading S. S. W. under all sail, saw one sail steering to the Westward, middle and latter part brisk breeze from E. to E. S. E. steering S. S. E. employed altering the new mainsail, saw a Bark. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 30. 27. Long. By obs. 43. 47. 15.
