W. by S. under double reefed topsails and courses, the M. H. Crapo in sight.

880. *Grampus's.*
Tuesday May 6th 1856.

W. under reefed topsails, latter part light breezes from E. S. E. heading to the N. E. under the topsails and courses, and broke out for water.

Wednesday May 7th 1856.
Commences with light breezes from S. S. E. heading to the S. W. under all sail, the Cooper employed repairing a water cask, saw one finback, middle part heading to the S. W. latter part light breezes from S. S. E. and pleasant, heading to the S. W. under all sail, three sails in sight.

882. *Windlass.*
Truss Band.
Thursday May 8th 1856.
Begins with very light breezes from the Southward heading N. S. W. under all sail, the watch employed cleaning and oiling the patent gear on the windlass, one sail in sight, middle part heading to the Westward, latter part very light airs from the S. W. heading to the N. W. employed fitting the truss band to the fore yard, and saw one sail.

883. *Iron Work.*
Four sails.
Friday May 9th 1856.
Commences with very light airs from S. W. heading S. E. by S. under all sail, the watch employed cleaning iron work, one sail in sight, (John & Edward) middle part light baffling airs and calms, latter part strong breezes from the S. E. and squally heading N. E. by E. under double reefed topsails and courses and saw four sails.
