E. with the top gallant sails out, and saw two sails and several humpbacks, middle part very moderate, latter part light breezes from E. to N. E. under all sail, saw several humpbacks, and a ship (supposed to be the John Coggeshall) standing to the S. W.

Friday May 30th 1856.

Begins with light breezes from N. E. and some squally heading to the N. W. under all sail, at 2 P. M. saw two large sperm whales working very slowly to the S. W. lowered three boats and gave chase. The starboard boat struck one and was stove, and lost one large line, at sunset had the stovon boat in, at dark the other boats gave up the chase and came aboard, the weather coming in thick and rainy, middle part moderate with some rain, latter part

light breezes from N. E. heading to the N. W. under all sail, and saw several humpbacks. Do ends. Lat. By obs. 23.19. Long. By calc. 104.16.15.

Saturday May 31st 1856.

Commences with light breezes from S. W. heading N. E. with the main top gallant sail and flying jib out, at sunset saw a sperm whale working to the Westward but too late to lower the boats, middle part heading to the Westward under double reefed topsails, latter part light breezes from S. heading to the Eastward under all sail except the fore top gallant sail, and employed repairing the starboard boat.

Do ends. Lat. By obs. 23.15. Long. By calc. 104.08.15.

Sunday June 1st 1856.

Begins with very light breezes from S. S. E. heading to the Eastward with the fore top gallant sail in, middle part heading to the Eastward under double reefed topsails, jib and spanker, latter part light breezes from S. S. E. heading to the S. East under all sail, and saw a dolphin.

Do ends. Lat. By obs. 23.10. Long. By calc. 104.36.30.

Good Sports. Repairing Starboard Boat.

Monday June 2nd 1856.

Commences with very light breezes from S. S. West and pleasant, heading to the S. E. under all sail, and saw a finback, shortly before sunset saw sports three miles too windward supposed to be sperm whales working to the N. W. middle part moderate, latter part light breezes from E. N. E. steering from West to N. with the top gallant sails out, employed repairing the starboard boat.
