977. Woods & Water.Tuesday Aug. 12th 1856.

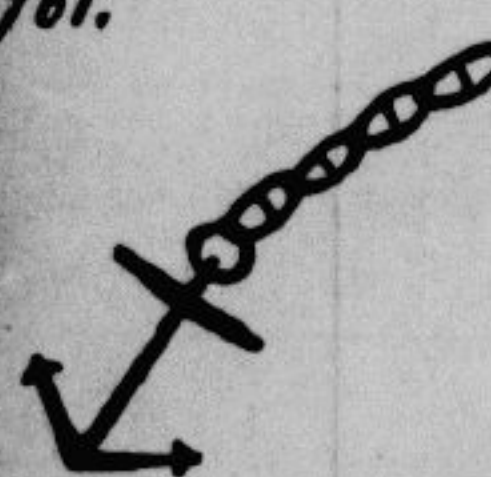
Begins with light breezes took off two boat loads of wood and five casks of water, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes employed stowing wood and water and clearing the decks. Do ends &c.

979. Hook the Anchor.Wednesday Aug. 13th 1856.

Commences with moderate breezes took off two boat loads of wood and stowed it away, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes off the Java shore at 6 A.M. took the anchor and started for Anjer, at noon we had passed Second point, and Third point in sight. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 6. 36'. Long. By obs. 105. 19. 30'.

980. Strong Current.Thursday Aug. 14th 1856.

Begins with very light airs and calms, at about 6 P.M. took a breeze from the S.E. Eastward and steered N.E. by N. middle part steering the same with a very strong current setting through the Great Channel, latter part light breezes from S.E. heading N.E. by E. and E.N.E. under all sail, for Anjer point. Do ends &c. Lat. By obs. 6. 16'.

981. Friday Aug. 15th 1856.

Commence with light breezes from N.W. heading over towards the Java shore under all sail, at 6.15 P.M. came to anchor in the N. part of Pepper Bay in 15 fathoms of water and paid out 45 fathoms of chain, Serigury Island bearing about S.S.E. per compass, Dist. 2 miles, middle part moderate, latter part light breezes from the Southward at 6 A.M. took the anchor and stood on for Anjer, shortly after noon came too in 10 fathoms of water and paid out 45 fathoms of chain, the Wild Pigeon and Shooting Star lying here. Do ends &c.

982. Liberty.Saturday Aug. 16th 1856.

Begins with very light breezes and pleasant weather, middle and latter part moderate, the larboard watch on liberty. Do ends &c.

983. Liberty.Sunday Aug. 17th 1856.

Commences with very light breezes, the Ship India arrived, middle and latter part moderate the starboard watch on liberty. Do ends &c.

Lying at Anjer. A.D. 1856.

Monday Aug. 18th 1856.

Interesting Scene.

Begins with light breezes and pleasant at night the watch came off with the exception of Mr. Morras, shortly after the boat was hoisted up Mr. Chase (1st Officer) went to his too see if there was any liquor brought off, he found a grass bag containing three bottles which he handed to me, when Mr. Caulk (2nd Officer) stepped forward and said that it was "Bin" and that it belonged to him, I put it in my room and while we were at the supper table Mr. Caulk told me that he was dissatisfied and wished to be discharged or, to make an exchange with the 2nd Officer of the Ship India, saying that he would rather beg his bread on the beach than to sail with me, after supper Mr. Caulk said that part of the above mentioned liquor belonged to the 2nd Officer of the India I delivered him one bottle, and held on to the other two till I had told him that I did not wish for him to make a bad use of it, he took them to the forward cabin, making use of some insolent expressions which I cannot now call to mind as I was not in a very pleasant mood at the time, but made mention of my using him like a hog as I was myself, Mr. Chase being on deck at the time and overhearing Mr. Caulk's expressions he came down in the cabin and reprimanded Mr. Caulk for making use of such abusive language to me, Mr. Caulk then began to talk to him and Mr. Chase said that he would not stand his abuse, and at about 6.15 P.M. Mr. Chase struck Mr. Caulk a blow with his hand or fist but he soon recovered from the blow and Mr. Chase put Mr. Caulk on a chest and held him there a short space of time, Mr. Caulk using his endeavors to kick Mr. Chase while in that position, when Mr. Chase let Mr. Caulk get up he said that it was over and now let it all drop, middle and latter part moderate, the larboard watch on liberty, the Ship Ocean Eagle of Boston arrived 12 days from Singapore for Boston. Do ends &c.

Liberty.Tuesday Aug. 19th 1856.

Commences with pleasant breezes from the Northward at night the liberty men came off, middle and latter part light breezes, the starboard watch on liberty, the other watch fitting the bobstays. Do ends &c.

Liberty.Wednesday Aug. 20th 1856.

Begins with light breezes, the Penelope of St. Yarrine, at night the watch came off, middle and latter part moderate breezes the larboard watch on liberty. Do ends &c.
