Double Reefs.

Monday Oct. 20th 1856.

Commences with strong breezes from E. heading to the S. E. with the jib and mainsail in, middle part laying to the Southward under short sail, latter part strong breezes from E. S. E. heading to the Northward under double reefed topsails and courses.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 23° 24'. Long. By Δ 48° 50' 00". Bar. 30.2.

Sonia & 3 other Sails.

Tuesday Oct. 21st 1856.

Begins with brisk breezes from the Eastward steering N. S. W. under double reefed topsails and foresail, two sails in sight, and saw a jumper, at night spoke the Sonia, middle part quite moderate, latter part wind from the N. E. steering N. E. W. under reefed topsails and courses, saw the Sonia, Stephania and two other Sails.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 23° 40'. Long. By Δ 48° 39' 15". Bar. 30.2.

Four Sails.

Wednesday Oct. 22nd 1856.

Commences with brisk breezes from N. E. steering N. S. W. and S. W. with the main top gallant sail out, saw four sails, middle part laying under short sail, latter part moderate breezes from E. heading to the Southward with the main top gallant sail and flying jib out.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 24° 09'. Long. By Δ 49° 12' 00". Bar. 30.2.

Sulphur Bottoms.

Thursday Oct. 23rd 1856.

Begins with light breezes from E. S. E. heading S. with the main top gallant sail and flying jib out, middle part laying under easy sail, latter part light breezes from the Eastward steering N. N. W. and saw several sulphur bottoms.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 24° 15'. Long. By Δ 48° 44' 30". Bar. 30.2.

Squally.

Friday Oct. 24th 1856.

Commences with brisk breezes from E. S. E. steering N. by N. till 2 P. M. then hauled on the wind to the Southward, middle part under short sail, latter part wind from E. S. E. and N. E. and squally with light falls of rain, heading to the Northward under double reefed topsails & courses.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 24° 01'. Long. By Δ 48° 54' 00". Bar. 30.2.

Off Fort. Dauphin. A. D. 1856.

Stingeray.

Saturday Oct. 25th 1856.

Begins with brisk breezes from the E. S. E. and some squally steering N. S. W. under double reefed topsails and foresail, and saw a stingeray, at sunset took in the fore topsail and steered S. S. W. till 10 P. M. then hauled on the wind and lay to the S. E. through the night, latter part moderate breezes from the N. E. steering N. with the main top gallant sail out.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 24° 19'. Long. By Δ 48° 32' 00". Bar. 30.1.

Dolphin.

Sunday Oct. 26th 1856.

Commences with pleasant breezes from N. E. steering N. S. W. with the main top gallant sail out, saw one sail and caught a dolphin, middle and latter part moderate breezes standing to the N. W. saw a Bark (Sonia probably) too windward cutting a whale.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 24° 29'. Long. By Δ 49° 44' 15" (unnapped) Bar. 30.1.

French Brig.

Monday Oct. 27th 1856.

Begins with light breezes from N. E. heading to the N. W. at 3 P. M. saw the land bearing N. N. W. per compass, Dist. 20 miles, then wore round to the E. S. E. and exchanged colors with a French Brig steering to the N. E. West, middle part moderate laying to the Eastward under double reefed topsails, latter part calm, the Sonia in sight boiling.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 24° 52'. Long. By Δ 48° 20' 45". Bar. 30.1.

1055.

Foresail & Main topsail.

Tuesday Oct. 28th 1856.

Commences with a calm, sent down the foresail and repaired it, at about 3 P. M. took a light breeze from the Southward, the Sonia still in sight, middle part moderate, latter part pleasant breezes from E. S. E. heading to the Northward employed repairing the cotton main topsail.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 25° 13'. Long. By Δ 48° 15' 45". Bar. 30.1.

Pleasant.

Wednesday Oct. 29th 1856.

Begins with pleasant breezes from N. N. E. steering N. N. W. with the main top gallant sail out, middle part steering S. S. W. latter part steering into the S. E. under double reefed topsails and courses.

So ends &c. Lat. By obs. 25° 17'. Long. By Δ 48° 25' 30". Bar. 30.1.
