Saturday Nov. 1st 1856.

Commenced with fresh breezes from E. N. E. heading to the S. E. under reefed top sails and courses the Bark M. H. Crapo in sight, middle and latter part the wind continues fresh from E. N. E. saw one sail too leeward (merchantman probably).

So ended. Lat. By obs. 25° 34'. Long. By obs. 48° 40' 00". Bar. 30.1.

W. with the main top gallant sail out.

Monday Nov. 3rd 1856.

Commenced with moderate breezes from N. N. E. heading to the N. W. with the main top gallant sail out, middle part laying to the Eastward, latter part fresh breezes from the N. E. heading N. W. by N. under reefed top sails and courses, saw one whaler too windward.

So ended. Lat. By obs. 24° 50'. Long. By obs. 48° 09' 15". Bar. 30.0.
